NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE AMERICAN LEGION INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA MAY 1-2, 1991

Resolution No. 24: Reaffirmation Of The American Legion Life Insurance Plan Preemption Origin: Subcommittee on Resolutions

Submitted By: Subcommittee on Resolutions

WHEREAS, The American Legion by action of the National Executive Committee, established in 1958 and improved in 1986, The American Legion Life Insurance Plan whereby it offered to its membership an opportunity to purchase low-cost term life insurance as members of a large national organization which program has through the years been managed and directed by The American Legion Life Insurance and Trust Committee, reporting through the National Finance Commission; and

WHEREAS, The American Legion has consistently refrained from offering non life insurance plans to its membership, after considerable study by special committees, even though it has been urged at various times to offer hospital indemnity insurance, medical insurance, dental insurance and other company insurance plans, feeling that it had preempted the Legion life insurance field by offering its official national programs and that the various departments could offer other insurance plans as they deemed advisable; and

WHEREAS, It appears that several departments are presently being requested by insurance companies to sponsor and to offer certain life insurance plans which will be in direct competition with our official and nationally approved American Legion Life Insurance Plan, which will create confusion among our membership as to the approved national plan, and which will weaken the promotional efforts of our national organization to the detriment of our national image; and

WHEREAS, This preemption of life insurance was first announced by the National Executive Committee in Resolution No. 27, adopted May 3-4, 1972, and reaffirmed in Resolution No. 38 adopted by the National Executive Committee May 4-5, 1988; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 1-2, 1991

- A. That the national organization declare that it has preempted the field of life insurance
- B. That all departments refrain from offering or sponsoring any life insurance plan or program other than the nationally approved American Legion Life Insurance Plans
- C. That any department which has been offered such plan or plans to phase out and discontinue immediately its sponsorship of same; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the national organization is hereby authorized to deny any department attempting to continue or establish a life insurance plan the right to use the emblem and name of The American Legion; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the National Commander be and he is hereby authorized to appoint a committee of three (3) members of the National Executive Committee to receive information and evidence from the National Adjutant and legal advice from the National Judge Advocate concerning any department which may be violating the aforementioned preemption, which committee shall make recommendations to the National Executive Committee for discipline up to and including revocation of the department charter, of any department found to be violating the aforementioned preemption in accordance with Article XI, Discipline of the National Constitution; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That this resolution be circularized annually by the National Adjutant to all departments.

Resolution No. 37: Reaffirmation of The American Legion Policy Concerning Affiliation With Other Organizations

Origin: Subcommittee on Resolutions

Submitted by: Subcommittee on Resolutions

WHEREAS, The American Legion adopted Resolution No. 6, National Executive Committee, October 10-11-12, 1952, concerning the affiliation of The American Legion with other organizations; and

WHEREAS, The adoption of that resolution was a reaffirmation of a long-established policy of The American Legion which has proved its wisdom by prohibiting The American Legion from joining any such organization, committee, association, council, or group in which The American Legion is not permitted a full voice and vote in determining matters of policy of such organization, committee, association, council or group; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 4-5, 1988, That The American Legion shall not be a member of, or affiliated with, any organization, committee, association, council or group whereby The American Legion might be committed to a policy contrary to that adopted by The American Legion; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That the National Adjutant is instructed to circulate this resolution to all Departments and National Officers of The American Legion on a yearly basis.

National Security News

KYIV, Ukraine — A young man shot a Russian military officer at close range at an enlistment office Monday, in an unusually bold attack reflecting resistance to the Russian leadership's efforts to mobilize hundreds of thousands of men to wage war on Ukraine.

The shooting comes after scattered arson attacks on enlistment offices and protests in Russian cities against the call-up that have resulted in at least 2,000 arrests. Russia is seeking to bolster its military as its Ukraine offensive has bogged down and sapped its forces. In the attack in the Siberian city of Ust-Ilimsk, 25-year-old local resident Ruslan Zinin walked into the enlistment office saying "no one will go to fight" and "we will all go home now," according to local media reports.

Concerns are growing that Russia may seek to escalate the conflict — including potentially using nuclear weapons once it completes what Ukraine and the West see as illegal referendums in parts of Ukraine under its control.

Thousands of residents had already fled the regions amid months of incessant fighting, and images shared by those who remained have showed armed Russian troops going door-to-door to pressure Ukrainians into casting a ballot. "Every night and day there is inevitable shelling in the https://www.dpaa.mil/Our-Missing/Recently-Accounted-For/ Donbas, under the roar of which people are forced to vote for

Russian 'peace," Donetsk regional governor Pavlo Kirilenko said Monday. Russia is widely expected to declare the results in its favor, a step that could see Moscow annex the territory and give it the pretext to defend it as its own Know Your Hurricane Risk territory under the Russian nuclear umbrella.

The Kremlin last week announced a partial mobilization its first since World War II — to add at least 300,000 troops to its force in Ukraine. The move, a sharp shift from Putin's previous efforts to portray the war as a limited military operation that wouldn't interfere with most Russians' lives, proved unpopular at home. Thousands of men of fighting age flocked to airports and Russia's land border crossings in an effort to avoid being called up. Protests erupted in various parts of the country, and Russian media reported an increasing number of arson attacks on military enlistment offices, including one that hit the southern city of Uryupinsk For complete story visit: https:// on Monday. www.military.com/daily-news/2022/09/26/drone-attack-hitsukraine-us-vows-consequences-over-nukes.html


