

#### National Security News Bites

NATO countries pitching in on fast-track preparation of air defense system for Ukraine. The U.S. and its allies are aiming to provide Ukraine with an integrated air defense system that will give enhanced protection to high-priority parts of the country, the top American military officer said Wednesday. The system, to be built from a range of assets from multiple countries, will involve everything from shortrange, low altitude systems to medium, long and highaltitude systems, Joint Chiefs Chairman Gen. Legion ham radio program to be handled locally. The American Legion Amateur Radio Club (TALARC) is no longer operating as a national program, due mainly to a lack of licensed ham radio operators on staff. Legion ham radio clubs and programs, meanwhile, continue to operate successfully at the local level. TALARC was created by resolution in 2011, and the club grew to become one of the largest in the nation. Both a hobby and a means of civildefense communications during natural disasters, ham radio has long been an interest of veterans, many of whom served in communications roles in the military. American Legion National Headquarters encourages continuation of ham radio programs at the local level but will no longer process memberships, manage the TALARC website - including posting net schedules and reports - or produce other promotional materials to operators. The TALARC web page will continue to appear on legion.org until Dec. 31, giving time for local clubs and members to copy or download any

resources they wish to use in the future on other platforms.

**Strong signals, By Alan W. Dowd.** With his army reeling and hemorrhaging, Russian strongman Vladimir Putin has doubled down on his blood-soaked blunder in Ukraine – <u>declaring</u> a "period of partial mobilization" designed to replenish the beleaguered Russian military with some 300,000 retired and reserve personnel. More ominously, in a <u>message</u> intended for Washington and Brussels rather than Kiev, Putin warns, "Our country also has various means of destruction ... When the territorial integrity of our country is threatened, to protect Russia and our people, we will certainly use all the means at our disposal." This is Putin's not-so-subtle signal that he's ready and willing to climb the nuclear ladder.

Know Your Risk for Winter Storms Pay attention to weather reports and warnings of freezing weather and winter storms. Listen for emergency information and alerts. Sign up for your community's warning system. The Emergency Alert System (EAS) and <u>National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio</u> also provide emergency alerts.

**Preparing for Winter Weather** Prepare your home to keep out the cold with insulation, caulking and weather stripping. Learn how to keep pipes from freezing. Install and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups. Gather supplies in case you need to stay home for several days without power. Keep in mind each person and pet's specific needs. Have extra batteries for radios and flashlights. If you are unable to afford your heating costs, weatherization or energy-related home repairs, contact the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) for help.
