My Fellow Legionnaires,


We are now heading in to the part of the membership year where, despite most of our strong efforts, our numbers seem to level off. More than ever, we must power through this and make every effort to achieve the best membership percentage as possible. This past February 10th was the National 85% Target Date and only 1 out of 7 Districts reached target (in fact, as of this writing, District 4 is just shy of 95%). District Commanders and Sr. Vice Commanders are in receipt of communication from Membership, Leadership and Learning Commission Chairman Jim LaCoursiere, announcing March 6-7 as "Operation Come Back" weekend. You can read more about this effort in Jim's bulletin message. All Districts and Posts need to take full advantage of this effort to reach as many recently expired members and advise them that their membership is important to not only the Department, but for the National organization as well. The National 90% target date is March 10th and National Commander Oxford has established a goal for the American Legion birthday on March 15th to reach 90% retention, meaning we have reached at least 90% of our membership and have received renewals for those expired members.

National has recently advised that in the last 2 years, the American Legion has lost in excess of 600,000 members who have not renewed their membership (this does not include members who have been lost to Post Everlasting). As I have posted in previous bulletin messages, Posts need to make every effort to retain their membership as well as create an atmosphere that attracts and retains younger veterans. It is time for the entire membership to recognize that the practice and opinion of "because that is the way it has always been done" is obsolete and is killing this great organization. It is time that we as an organization accept a change in our culture and allow the next generation of veterans to also start making this their American Legion while our older members mentor their efforts, allowing them to gain that institutional knowledge that makes the American Legion great. As a candidate for Department Commander for 2021-2022, I have established "Tomorrow's American Legion is Today's Responsibility" as my theme. It is our responsibility to lay the foundation for the next 100 years for the American Legion and we have to start NOW.

I would also like to state that the submission of CPRs and Post Data Forms are fast approaching and every Post needs to recognize this requirement to submit. These forms are not difficult to complete and it is not asking too much to shoot for 100% submission.

Do you feel current members of the military should be paid more than a youngster working at McDonalds? Do you feel it is important to have a strong national defense? And do you feel our children should grow up with a sense of patriotism and respect for veterans? If your answer to all these questions is "yes" then The American Legion would like to have you remain in our corner and help us renew the members who have not yet renewed, as well as helping us grow our great organization. As a family of The American Legion, we must keep in mind, regardless of the color of the hat we wear or the position we may hold, is that we are first and foremost members of an American Legion Post, Unit, and/or Squadron. NATIONAL OFFERING GRANTS TO POSTS IN NEED!

At the 2020 Fall National Executive Committee Meeting, Resolution #36, Subject: Mission Blue Post Assistance Program was approved. Posts impacted by a government's public health restrictions implemented in response to the COVID-19 pandemic may apply for a grant up to \$1,000. Posts must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- A post must have a current consolidated post report on file.
- A post must have filed an IRS 990 within the prescribed due date.
- A post must have filed all other required forms and reports as prescribed by the departments.
- A post must have actively participated in one or more The American Legion(s) within the last 18 months.
- A post must have a financial need.
- A post must provide a certificate of insurance naming The American National Headquarters as an additional insured (copy of insurance declaration will be attached to application).
- A post must provide documentation indicating that the post is properly incorporated.

The funds from this grant program shall be used exclusively for the following:

- Current and past due mortgage principal and interest or
- Current and past due real estate rents or
- Current and past due insurance premiums or
- Current and past due utilities.

The American Legion posts receiving this grant are required to submit a true and accurate report outlining how the funds were used, signed by the post finance officer, and certified by the post commander or post adjutant within six-months of receipt of the grant funds or no later than February 22, 2022. Whichever comes first.

The enclosed application form with the instruction sheet provides more submission information and where to send the application upon completion.

****IMPORTANT LIQUOR PERMIT UPDATE****

The Governor has extended his executive orders through April 15, 2021, this means you will not be required to renew your liquor permits during this time. This give the legislature time to pass S.B. 263 An Act Concerning Club Permit and Non-Profit Club Permit Fees. This will reduce your liquor permit fees to a standard \$815.00 across the board. Please contact your local representatives and let them know that this bill needs to be passed into law as soon as possible.

We expect to mail the Post CPR & Squadron CPR forms with the Post Data Forms in early March. You can also enter your data (directly to National) via myLegion.org. All **CPR** Forms must be in Department HQ by June 3rd.

American Legion Baseball

Background checks are required for all coaches & managers (anyone directly involved with players). The website for this is: https://opportunities.averity.com/ALConnecticut Drivers License, Social Security number & credit card (for \$8.00 fee) are needed. Starting January 1 through February 15, online Team Registration can start, but will not be approved for insurance and completion until coaches & managers listed have passed the background check. Dear American Legion Family and Friends,

I hope you have heard the exciting news that The American Legion has moved to a single sign-on for its collection of websites. This is great news for American Legion members and non-members since they will need to only have one username and password when they visit American Legion national (not department) websites.

This will mean easier access to American Legion related websites including Legion.org, MyLegion.org, Legiontown.org, Centennial.legion.org, Burnpit.us and Baseball.legion.org.

At this time, this does not apply to registered users of the Emblem Sales website.

The single sign-on is the first step of many changes that are coming to improve user access and experience with MyLegion.org and Legion.org, that will build a foundation for the future for The American Legion. I'm very excited to be a part of this, and I hope you are too.

In order to enjoy the benefit of this new single sign-on, current registered users of the aforementioned American Legion websites need to take a moment to re-register. The reason for the re-registration is that American Legion National Headquarters moved from a vendor proprietary system that required us to renew accounts for all American Legion web properties, and the new platform requires each user to have a unique email address as the username. Please note that all member information is still within MyLegion, securely and safely housed.

Here are the five steps to set up your single sign-on account:

- 1. Click "Sign In" on an American Legion national website property. You will be taken to our SSO site at **sso.legion.org**.
- 2. Click "Register as a new user." Fill in the form using your best contact email address and member ID (if applicable).
- 3. Enter and confirm your desired password.
- 4. Click "Finish" to receive your confirmation email.

5. In the confirmation email, click the link to confirm your account. The provided email will be from *sso@legion.org*.

It is important that you confirm the sent confirmation email from *sso@legion.org*. Please check your junk email folder if you don't see this email in your inbox. This step finalizes your account for single sign-on access.

As American Legion national website users re-register, there have been questions about the process. If you have questions, **please see our most frequently asked questions** to help you with the re-registration process.

I mentioned previously that this single sign-on is the initial step of many that will allow The American Legion to provide a streamlined and better user experience within its web environment. So thank you for your patience as we navigate this process. Our focus is you, making your time on American Legion national websites valuable, resourceful and easy to navigate.

Change, continuity and new commander in chief By Alan W. Dowd

As a new commander in chief prepares to take the reins, the world can expect both change and continuity in the overlapping areas of foreign policy and national security - perhaps more continuity than many observers are predicting.

Unlike the president he served under and the president he succeeds, President-elect Joe Biden, owing to his many years of public service, has a lengthy track record on defense and diplomacy. That record and the foreignpolicy vision statement he recently shared offer clues The Department National/Homeland Security and as to what lies ahead.

Biden notes that since the end of World War II the United States has "played a leading role in writing the rules, forging the agreements, and animating the institutions that guide relations among nations, and advance collective security and prosperity." If America fails to play that role, he warns, "either someone else will take the United States' place, but not in a way that advances our interests and values, or no one will, and chaos will ensue. Arnold F. Benson, Jr. Old Saybrook Post 113

John H. Bruno Trumbull Post 141 (Deceased)

JOHN H. BRUNO Trumbull Post 141

John Harry Bruno was born on June 21, 1926 and died on Monday, June 22, 2015 just one day shy of his 89th birthday. in Bonita Springs, FL Prior to moving to Florida for health, he lived in Stepney, Conn.

After proudly serving his country with the US Navy during World War II, John attended Arnold College where he received a bachelor's degree in physical education; Columbia University Teachers College, where he received a master's in education; and Fairfield University where he earned a sixth-year degree in education and administration. John taught elementary education at Glenville Elementary, Greenwich, CT and then spent thirty years teaching sixth grade math and science at Nichols and Booth Hill Elementary Schools in Trumbull.

Throughout his years in Trumbull, John was active in the Trumbull High School Scholarship Program, youth baseball from Little League to Legion baseball, and Trumbull Day Ceremonies.

He was an Honorary Life Member of the American Legion Post 141 for over 50 years. He served in most officer and committee positions up through Commander. He was the Post 141 Commander during the 50th year Celebration. John was active in American Legion Baseball and he was a member or chairman of Memorial Day activities in Trumbull up to about 2005.

He was passionate about writing poetry. He authored "That Loyal Legionnaire." The poem became the Connecticut American Legion Poem in 1978.

John was known for so much more than his poems. Sometime in the 1990s, John Bruno and Trumbull Post 141 was recognized and received the National Children and Youth Star Award for their Youth Programs. And about the same time, John was recognized for an Americanism program: "Flags for First Graders." As I understand it, he did the program some 30 years... every year before and after retirement.

When his name was submitted this year. Joe Jackson noted that "John was a great Legionnaire, a mentor to many and a fine gentleman."

ARNOLD F. BENSON, Jr. The "Still Serving America" Commander

Arnold F. Benson, Jr. is an American Legion Honorary Life member of Faulk-Marcolini-Newman Post 113 for the last 50 years and a Deep River squadron 61 member for the last 41 years. Today, he is married to Jimmy Sue. They live in Scottsmoor, FL just up the road from his daughter, Ginger and the Grand & Great Grand Children.

After graduating from Old Saybrook High School and working for Pratt and Whitney, he enlisted and served honorably in the US Marine Corps in the 60s. When he came home from South East Asia, he went back to work for Pratt and Whitney as an artisan, teacher, a police chief in Chester and as an active member of The American Legion. His early mentors were Bill Chapel and Jake Allard.

In 1974, he was elected Post Commander, 7th District Finance Officer, a member of the orangegrapefruit 7th district fund raiser with Mel Jones, Ed Barry & Richard Anderson. In 1976, he was the 7th District Commander. He was part of the Art Winschel and Ray Anderson 7th District Officers, who mentored and helped Veterans like Frank Warmsley, Post 64, Chet Blutcher, Post 156 and John Scanlon, Post 75 understand the slogan "Still Serving America." Arnie helped Post 61 with their Legion Baseball, started a post fund raiser for Boys, Girls' State and School Awards. In 1977, with the Deep River Legion baseball team folding, he started an Old Saybrook baseball team as the team Manager with Paul Lavoie, as the coach. He formed a post color guard; which Marty Hill took over in the 1990s. And assisted Tony Mammola with the Old Saybrook Memorial Day Parade. He was the Dept. Executive committeeman in 1976-78, and then for Chet Blutcher and Ron Schaefer in the 80s and 90s, 7th District Adjutant for Robert Magowan and Assistant Dept Sgt-At-Arms for Dept. Commander Milt Moritz. He was on Dept. Committees: Awards, Membership, National Security and Law and Order. National Executive Committeeman Joseph G. Leonard appointed Arnie first to the National Membership Council and then to the National Security Council.

Arnold F. Benson, Jr., his most important job was as a teacher, a mentor for Legionnaires like Frazier Brinley, Robert Kennedy, Art Paul, Charlie Obuchowski, Frank Cook, Bob Wienshenk, Bob Magowan, and Marty Hills.

Arnold F Benson, Jr.: US Marine, Post Commander, District Commander, Department Vice Commander, Department Assistant Sgt-At-Arms, Department Executive Committeeman, Police Chief, Father, Grand Father, Great Grandfather, husband, friend, mentor and a 2021 member of the Legionnaires Hall of Fame.

Worldwide electronics leader Samsung endowed a scholarship fund of \$5 million to be administered by The American Legion in 1996. Meant to show appreciation for U.S. veterans who came to Korea's aid during its struggle against communist forces in the Korean War, the Samsung American Legion Scholarship Program established a series of scholarships derived from interest and other income from the principal amount. As of 2019 the Samsung American Legion Scholarship has awarded more than \$6.5 million in college scholarships to 2,266 applicants since its inception in 1996.

The application window for the Samsung American Legion Scholarship opens February 1st each year. High School Juniors only!

Deadline

Scholarship applicants must complete and submit their online application prior to 11:59 (local time) of Day 1 of their respective American Legion Boys State or American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program. All applications must be submitted using the online application system and <u>may not be modified after the due date or given a deadline extension under any circumstance.</u>

Participants should check their individual program coordinator as to whether or not the coordinator desires them to bring a hard copy of their submitted application materials. If a hard copy is required, participants will need to complete their application PRIOR to arrival at their respective program.

Award Amounts

Samsung scholarships may be used for undergraduate studies and applied toward tuition, books, fees, and room and board. Winners are selected according to academic record, involvement in school and community service.

- Ten National Scholars receive \$10,000 each (two from each region)
- Ten National Runners-Up receive \$5,000 each (two from each region)
- Remaining Department Finalists receive \$1,250 each guaranteed

Eligibility

Scholarship applications are limited to students between their junior and senior years of high school who attend the current session of either an American Legion Boys State or American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program and are a direct descendant - i.e. child, grandchild, great grandchild, etc. - or a legally adopted child of a wartime U.S. military veteran who served on active duty during at least one of the periods of war officially designated as eligibility dates for American Legion membership.

Applicants who are direct descendants of Korean War Era Veterans will receive three bonus points.

Applicants who upload a copy of a current membership to the American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion will receive a bonus point or may receive a bonus point by uploading a current membership card of a parent in The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion. No more than one bonus point for Legion Family membership will be awarded per application.

POST GRANT (Application–Page 3): The Mission Blue Post Assistance Program (PAP) grant is intended to assist posts whose revenue has been negatively impacted from the effects of the COVID-19 health crisis within the community, as well as any government-mandated restrictions. The funds distributed from this grant are to be exclusively used to meet financial responsibilities associated with maintaining post facilities and community presence. Grants are only approved to cover costs and fees associated with mortgage payments, rent, insurance premiums, and/or utilities. Recipient posts are prohibited from using funds to maintain or cover a loss of income from any registered post business (including but not limited to post bars, cantinas, restaurants, etc.) paying post employees, building upgrades or repairs, taxes, fines/fees/penalties, or funding post activities and programs. Posts who meet all the required criteria may receive up to \$1,000.00 from the Mission Blue PAP fund. Department commanders/adjutants are encouraged to complete a Mission Blue PAP grant application on behalf of the post.

<u>OUALIFYING CRITERIA</u>: American Legion posts who meet all qualifying criteria for the Mission Blue PAP Grant are eligible to receive up to \$1,000.00. Department commanders/adjutants must certify the applicant post meets the following criteria:

- Must have a consolidated post report on file.
- Must have filed an IRS 990 within the prescribed due date.
- Must have filed all other required forms and reports as prescribed by the department.
- Must have actively participated in one or more American Legion program(s) within the last 18 months.
- Must have a financial need.
- Must provide a certificate of insurance for all liability coverage naming The American Legion doing business as (dba) American Legion National Headquarters and the post's department as an additional insured. (Submit declaration page showing coverage)
- Must provide documentation indicating that the post is properly incorporated.

REQUIRED APPLICATION INFORMATION (Application–Page 3): Department leadership must verify that applicant posts meet all the qualifying criteria prior to submission of the grant application. Posts and departments do not need to submit any bills or receipts along with grant applications. The application must be filled out completely and accurately to prevent delay in processing. Grant requests may be submitted in fillable PDF format and sent via email to <u>IA@legion.org</u>. Any questions regarding this grant should be directed to the Internal Affairs & Membership Division.

<u>APPROVAL SIGNATURE OF GRANT APPLICATIONS</u>: Upon review, if additional information is needed, the department will be contacted. If the application is properly completed and all qualifying criteria and requirements are met, the Internal Affairs & Membership Division will endorse the application and forward a request for funds to the Finance Division. After review and approval by the National Adjutant, a check will be issued and forwarded to the department headquarters to disburse to the applicant post along with a grant fulfillment letter which will also include reporting instructions.

If any of the above steps have not been taken, the application may be returned to the department headquarters for amendment or further clarification. Applications not approved will be returned to the department headquarters with reasons for disapproval who will then notify the applicant post.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Posts are required to submit a true and accurate report outlining how the grant funds were used (mortgage, rent, insurance premiums, and/or utilities) within six months of the receipt of funds and no later than February 28, 2022. Information regarding the report format and submission will be included within the grant fulfillment letter. This report should be reviewed by department headquarters prior to forwarding it to the Internal Affairs & Membership Division at the national headquarters.



Gold Star Families Monument coming to Berlin, CT

(Berlin, CT) – The Town of Berlin Veterans Commission is proud to announce that Berlin, CT has been chosen to be the home of the "Gold Star Families Monument" in Connecticut.

This monument is being built to: To honor, recognize, and serve Gold Star Families and the legacy of their Loved Ones who have paid the ultimate sacrifice.

The monument will be built in the Berlin Veterans Memorial Park on Veterans Way. We are hoping to have it built and dedicated on **Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day** which is the last Sunday in September. That will be **September 26, 2021**.

We are collaborating with the Woody Williams Medal of Honor Foundation to build a Gold Star Families Memorial Monument in Connecticut. It is a 501(c)(3) organization. <u>http://hwwmohf.org/ct-monument.html</u>

The Hershel "Woody" Williams Medal of Honor Foundation is a charitable 501c(3) nonprofit organization that pursues specific endeavors and goals through the vision of Medal of Honor recipient Hershel "Woody" Williams. The Foundation encourages, with the assistance of the American public and community leaders, establishing permanent Gold Star Families Memorial Monuments in communities throughout the United States, conducting Gold Star Families Outreach across the country, providing Living Legacy scholarships to eligible Gold Star Children, and advocating for educational benefits for all Gold Star Family members.

The impact of the Foundation's work helps to raise public awareness about Gold Star Families' enduring sacrifice and the ultimate sacrifice made by their Loved Ones. The Foundation wishes to educate the community about these sacrifices, reminding us all that freedom has not been and is not free.

Pillars of the Foundation

The Foundation developed the mission and goals for honoring Gold Star Families based on five philosophical pillars representing Homeland, Family, Patriot, Sacrifice and Legacy. They were important to the fallen loved ones who made the ultimate sacrifice, the families who continue to endure their sacrifice and the Legacy they have left behind. These pillars are so profound that they inspired the creation and model of the Gold Star Families Memorial Monument as it is today.

The Gold Star Families Memorial Monument is two sided. The front specifically honors Gold Star Families with the statement, "A Tribute to Gold Star Families and Relatives Who Sacrificed a Loved One for Our Freedom". The reverse of the monument shows the pillars and representative images for each. And, within the monument there is an open silhouette that represents the missing family member surrounded by the pillars and the legacy they left behind.

Veterans seek a hand building statewide Gold Star memorial in Berlin

If they can raise about \$50,000 this year, Peter Galgano and a volunteer organization plan to erect a monument in September as Connecticut's way to honor the sacrifice of Gold Star families. The Gold Star Families Memorial Monument Connecticut organization wants to put up the black granite monument in Berlin, the geographic center of the state.

"Some states have two or three of these monuments, but this would be the only one in Connecticut," said Galgano, a Berlin resident who works extensively on veterans' issues in the state. Plainville has a small stone memorial for that town's Gold Star families, but the Berlin monument will be the only one connected with the nonprofit Woody Williams Medal of Honor Foundation and is intended for all Connecticut Gold Star families.

Based in Louisville, the foundation seeks to place identical 7-foot-high, 12foot-long granite monuments across the country. So far, they stand in more than 45 states. The monuments are divided into four, with the most prominent feature a cut-out silhouette of a saluting service member. Galgano wanted Connecticut's memorial to be in Veterans Memorial Park in his town and was excited in the fall when a statewide Gold Star monument committee chose that as the best location.

"When Berlin was picked as the location, a lot of families contacted me to say they love the location because it's easy to get to from Danbury or Bridgeport or wherever, and they love the park, too. The monument will be for families of military service members who lost their lives while serving the country. Its name goes back to WWI, when families with someone serving in the military put up a flag with a blue star at

Albany, New York, and Exter, Rhode Island, have the closest Gold Star monuments to Connecticut. Volunteers in the state have been working with the Woody Williams Medal of Honor Foundation to put one in Connecticut and have a Facebook page for the campaign: <u>tinyurl.com/y36ycp5g</u>.

their home. If the relative was killed, a gold star replaced the blue one.

Although it has no monument, Connecticut does pay tribute to its Gold Star families. The I-95 bridge between New London and Groton is named the Gold Star Bridge, and the state also provides specialized license plates to members of Gold Star families.

Volunteers hope to have the monument built by Sept. 26, which is designated this year as Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day. "COVID has delayed things, but we're still aiming for that — and at the very minimum, a dedication and groundbreaking that day," Galgano said Tuesday.

Berlin and its veterans commission will put in about \$15,000 to \$20,000 of the remaining \$70,000 expense, either through cash or services, he said.

Organizers are looking for veterans service groups including VFW and American Legion posts to pitch in, and maintain a fund at <u>hwwmohf.kindful.com/?campaign=346773</u>. They emphasize that donations must be designated "Connecticut memorial."
