We should be looking forward to Post/District elections and filing of REQUIRED paperwork (Post Data Forms, Consolidated Post reports).

I want to congratulate everyone for the strong surge in membership. As of this bulletin, the Department sits in 19th place nationally, just short of 90%. The 95% target date is April 13th and we are currently 905 renewals short. We have already held several highly successful District revitalizations, with more scheduled this month. I commend Membership, Leadership and Learning Commission Chairman Jim LaCoursiere for his dedicated efforts, as well as Senior Vice Commander Rich Linnon and all the members who contributed their time for these events. I ask everyone to keep this momentum going, reach out to expired members (2021 and 2022) and try to determine what is keeping them from renewing. If a member indicates that they are unable to renew for a specific reason, see if you can provide a helping hand and avoid losing a member that could be saved. This is also the time to be contacting both current and expired Post 200 members as well and attempt to get them to transfer into a Post. In July, the national organization will be sending 2023 renewal notices to these members. When these members respond to this notice and renew, a Post will not receive credit for a transfer until membership year 2024.

I thank the entire membership for your service to this country and to "our" American Legion. Stay well.

As of March 30, 2022, the Department of Connecticut is in 21st place nationally and 8th place in the Northeast Division at 89.65%, which also reflects a renewal rate of 89.04%. Working together and communicating with our members, let's continue driving our membership growth forward. We, as a Commission are here to guide, assist, and support every Post in this Department with membership and training. We must remember all of our other members, and reach out to them as well with buddy checks to see how they are doing. All year long we've been encouraging the Posts to start going after the Post 200 members immediately to try to transfer them into a local Post, and try to get them to pay their dues to the local Post, or worse case to at least renew their dues with Post 200, if they have not done so yet. Some Posts have really been working this angle, and are realizing that it is an added beneficial tool. We've been encouraging everyone to perform the Buddy Checks, and to allow your membership to know that you do care, as well as to inform them as to what is going on with your Post. For the Department of Connecticut to achieve 100% for the 2021-2022 membership year, it must be a team effort, and all Districts' leadership should be on board, and feel comfortable to ask for ANY type of assistance as and when needed. The Membership, Leadership & Learning Commission has already supported District Revitalizations in the 6th and 4th Districts, with the 3rd District scheduled for April 2nd and the 7th District on April 16th. If your District or Post would like assist with performing a revitalization, just let us know and we will be there. Once the District gives us the date, time, and location of the event, we will contact the national organization to assist with materials and marketing, if we are given sufficient notice. Members of the commission will also be present at the revitalization to assist and support.

The Commission has continued to meet every month this membership year, and we've been meeting in person at Post 75 and via "Zoom" with both voice and video chat, dependent upon state restrictions and safety guidance. A subcommittee of the commission, Leadership & Learning has been meeting regularly via Zoom, working very diligently and productively on various training formats, ideologies, and needs for the American Legion family, Department of Connecticut. They are currently putting together specific training modules for the District and Post level, focus on attracting and training current and upcoming officers. There's something in the air. Can you feel it? I'm not talking about Spring, although that's also in the air and it feels great. But so does this other feeling. And that's the feeling that we are well within striking distance of hitting our membership goals!

Yep, that's right. We are on the verge of getting rid of the COVID curse and getting back to our pre-COVID membership status. We can and will reverse the trend of declining membership. And it means we will have more Legionnaires available to help plan, schedule, and participate in local community events.

But it will require some effort. We can't just sit back and wait for our members to renew. We simply cannot wait by the phone for a qualified veteran to call us and ask to join. We have to get out in the community, find those veterans and explain the many benefits of joining the largest and greatest Veterans Service Organization in the country. And when they join, chances are they will tell their buddies who will also want to belong. We have to continue making "Buddy Checks," not only to expired members, but to all our members. They need to know we care and are interested in their well-being. Also, we have to work those DMS numbers and transfer members from our holding Posts into our local Post, because we know our chances of keeping members greatly increase when members belong to a local Post.

So, let's activate/reactivate and energize/reenergize those membership teams and get the 8! Matter of fact, let's get a couple more than the 8 so we can help those few Posts who just aren't going to be able to get there.

Together we can "git 'er done!" Can you feel it?

All **CPR** Forms must be in Department HQ by June 3rd. You can also enter your data (directly to National) via myLegion.org. We have yet to receive Consolidated Squadron Reports from National.

Department Convention is fast approaching, this year's convention will be held on July 8-9, 2022, at the Trumbull Marriott Hotel. We will be mailing out the call to convention and all other forms the beginning of May so be on the lookout.

Posts and Districts make sure that you have all required forms filled out and sent back to Department Headquarters by the required deadlines.

Remember, if you are registering the morning of convention only the Commander, Adjutant or duly appointed representative can register the Post. If you have someone designated, they must have a signed letter from the Post Commander authorizing them to register the delegation otherwise you will have to register as a guest.

National Security News

Putin's war, NATO's unity, Ukraine's valor

Vladimir Putin's "unprovoked, unjustified, unconscionable [war](#)" has taken thousands of lives, destroyed much of Ukraine's modern infrastructure and ancient landmarks, and created the largest tidal wave of refugees in Europe since World War II. Yet amidst all these horrors, there's a flicker of hope: The NATO alliance is more united than at any time since 9/11 – and more important than at any time since [11/9](#). This is the very opposite of what Putin expected.

Common cause

Consider how the 30-member alliance swiftly [rejected](#) Putin's December [demands](#) that NATO not expand to include Ukraine, cease its deterrence operations in Eastern Europe and grant him veto authority over the decisions of sovereign nations. Then, as Putin massed more than 180,000 troops, hundreds of tanks and dozens of warships on Ukraine's borders and coasts, the alliance set about the task of bolstering its easternmost members.

The United States deployed [B-52s](#) to Britain; [F-35s](#) to Germany, [Lithuania and Estonia](#); F-15s to [Poland](#) and [Estonia](#); [F-16s](#) to Romania; dozens of [AH-64 attack helicopters](#) to the Baltics and Poland; [Patriot](#) air-defense batteries and [thousands of combat troops](#) to Poland; an armored brigade combat team of [7,000 soldiers](#) to Germany; hundreds of troops to [Hungary](#), [Bulgaria](#) and [Romania](#); and [800 combat troops](#) to the Baltics. There are now about [100,000 U.S. troops](#) standing guard all across Europe.

In addition, Washington approved a long-delayed [sale](#) of 250 M1A2 tanks to Poland, and surged the aircraft carrier USS *Harry S. Truman* to join [carrier strike groups](#) from Italy and France in a show of force in the northern Mediterranean.

Like all insurance policies, there are costs associated with NATO. [A recent study](#) revealed that U.S. defense expenditures earmarked for Europe amount to \$36 billion per year. That's not a trivial amount of American taxpayers' money. But consider what America gets in exchange for that insurance premium: a hedge against another [Argonne](#) or Normandy, a Europe reinforced against invasion, and [economic](#) benefits that exponentially exceed those premium costs.

With Putin trying to reconstitute the Russian Empire and reverse the settled outcomes of Cold War I, NATO is proving its worth yet again. As Gen. James Mattis puts it, "If we did not have NATO today, we would need to create it." For the complete story and more visit:

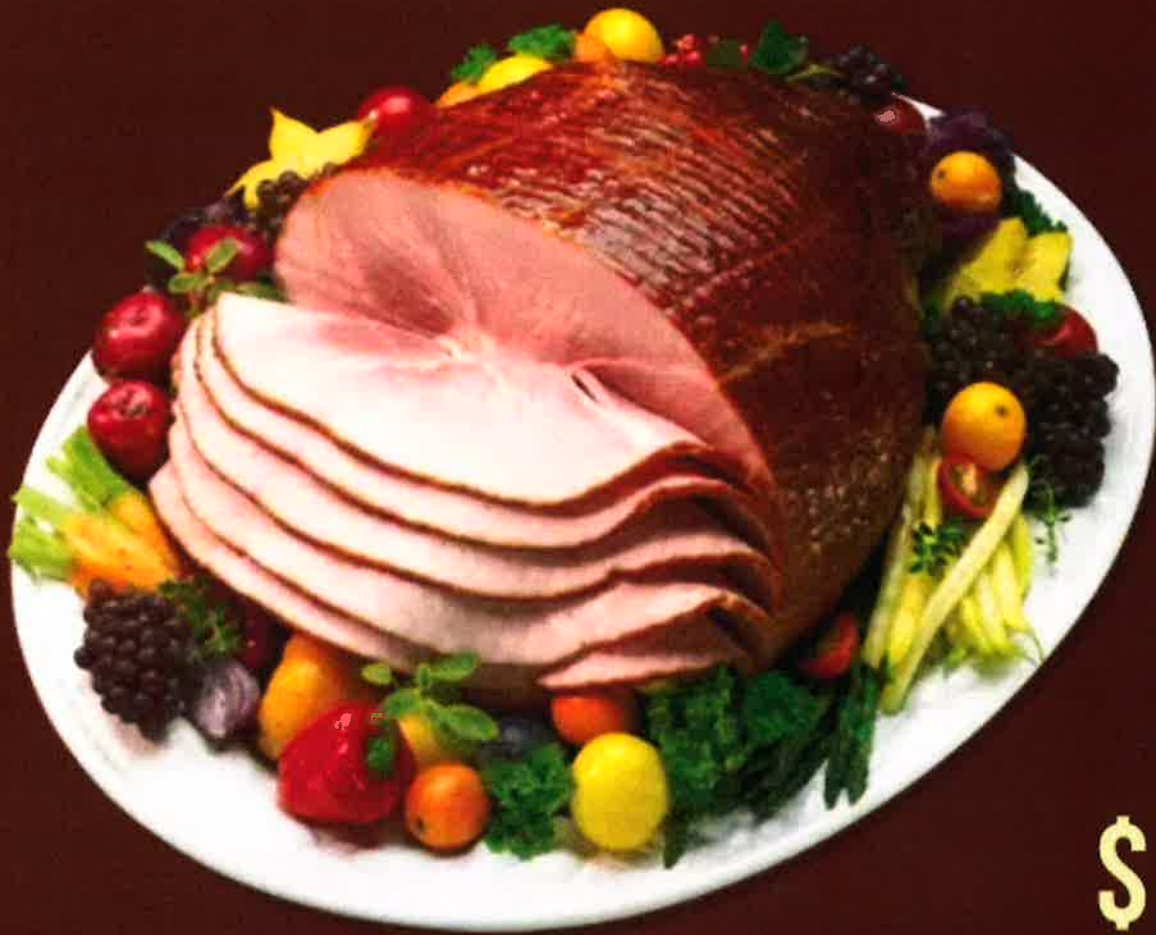
