The information obtained from the PDF is vital for National to begin preparing the 2023 Membership cards. Posts should also be geared up to submit your Consolidated Post Reports with the reporting period ending on April 30, 2022.

Additionally, Posts and Districts should be ready to present your slate of officer nominations at your May meetings, with the vote to be held in June. Each of my monthly Bulletin messages have included my theme of "Tomorrow's American Legion is Today's Responsibility" at the top of the page. I haven't referenced it much throughout the year but, there is no more important a time than now to put it in to action. Post/Districts should be taking a hard look at your younger members and see if they have displayed an interest and/or the potential to serve in an officer/chairman position. "The choosing of officers for a Legion group is one of the most important functions. It means the choosing of leaders upon whose faithful service the success of the organization largely depends. Among the qualifications necessary for efficient official leadership is an understanding of the purpose of The American Legion; knowledge of the work and enthusiasm for it; a high sense of justice, fairness, and courtesy; open-mindedness, moral courage and the ability to get along with other people.

Officers should be chosen for their ability to perform the work of the office to which they are elected, and not because of their social prestige or because they want the office. Willingness to serve is not enough; fitness to serve must stand above every other consideration".

Looking forward, we have Boy's State, Connecticut State Police Youth Week and Department Convention all coming up. Additional information is provided in this Bulletin.

Be sure to read the Senior Vice Commander and Membership, Leadership and Learning Commission Chairman's messages concerning the Department membership efforts necessary to achieve 100%.



As of April 27, 2022, the Department of Connecticut is in 24th place nationally and 8<sup>th</sup> place in the Northeast Division at 91.56%, which also reflects a renewal rate of 90.51%. All year long and especially the last few months, I've been emphasizing the fact that we must remember all of our other members, and reach out to them as well with buddy checks to see how they are doing. All year long we've been encouraging the Posts to start going after the Post 200 members immediately to try to transfer them into a local Post, and try to get them to pay their dues to the local Post, or worse case to at least renew their dues with Post 200, if they have not done so yet. For the Department of Connecticut to achieve 100% for the 2021-2022 membership year, it must be a team effort, and all Districts' leadership should be on board, and feel comfortable to ask for ANY type of assistance as and when needed. During the month of April, the Membership, Leadership & Learning Commission supported District Revitalizations with the 3<sup>rd</sup> District and the 7<sup>th</sup> District.

At this time, I'm highly encouraging every District within the Department to fully utilize their respective District officers and directly work with Posts within your District to concentrate on Post renewals, as well as fully working the Post 200 listings for the members that have not renewed this year. I'm asking all Districts to be directly involved with every Post in your District, using a face to face and hands on approach to working the membership. In my travels around the Department, I'm always hearing that a phone call was made or an email was sent to the under achieving Posts, and then nothing further is said or happens. What I'm asking of the District leadership, is to reach out to the Post, and find out "when" the Post is willing to have a District officer meet with and assist them in making direct contact with the non-renewed members, as well as consider working the Post 200 roster. The numbers are there and are sustainable for the department of Connecticut to achieve 100% percent prior to the Department convention. With the National membership target date of May 11th, for 100%, I feel that we can shoot for 95% at that time, which equates to needing 564 cards. Yes, it does take a little work and strong effort, but keep in mind that working membership truly is and can be a lot of fun. 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### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

All Posts, please read below. We periodically receive calls about why we are not sales tax exempt; well things have changed! Below you will find that 501(c)19 organizations are included in the state statues. What does this mean for our Legion Posts, you will now be able to claim sales tax exemption when making purchases that qualify under the below section. Please pay close attention to the RED highlighted section as this is especially important, you must have either the original or a copy of your determination letter from the IRS and CERT-119 to receive sales tax exemption and this **MUST** be done for each purchase. #### AN ACT CONCERNING A SALES TAX EXEMPTION FOR VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly:

Section 1. Subdivision (8) of section 12-412 of the 2008 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (8) Sales of tangible personal property or services to any organization that is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or any veterans' organization that is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501 (c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or any subsequent corresponding internal revenue code of the United States, as from time to time amended, and that the United States Treasury Department has expressly determined, by letter, to be an organization that is described in Section 501(c)(3) or (13) of said internal revenue code. At the time of the sale that is exempt under this subsection, the organization shall, in order to qualify for said exemption, do one of the following: (A) Present to the retailer (i) a copy of the United States Treasury Department determination letter that was issued to such organization, and (ii) a certificate, in such form as the commissioner may prescribe, certifying that a United States Treasury Department determination letter has been issued to such organization and has not been revoked and that the tangible personal property or services that are being purchased from the retailer by such organization are to be used or consumed exclusively for the purposes for which such organization was established, or (B) present to the retailer (i) a copy of the exemption permit that was issued pursuant to this subsection by the commissioner to such organization before July 1, 1995, after a determination of eligibility by the commissioner, and (ii) a certificate, in such form as the commissioner may prescribe, certifying that an exemption permit was issued pursuant to this subsection by the commissioner to such organization before July 1,

1995, and was not revoked and that the tangible personal property or services that are being purchased from the retailer by such organization are to be used or consumed exclusively for the purposes for which the organization was established. The organization shall be liable for the tax otherwise imposed if such tangible personal property or services are not used or consumed exclusively for the purposes for which the organization was established.

If you have someone designated, they must have a signed letter from the Post Commander authorizing them to register the delegation otherwise you will have to register as a guest.

## **CERT-119**

## Purchases of Tangible Personal Property and Services by Qualifying Exempt Organizations

**General Purpose:** A qualifying exempt organization must issue this certificate to retailers when purchasing items to be used by the organization exclusively for the purposes for which it was established. Under Conn. Gen. Stat. §12-412(8), a qualifying exempt organization is either:

- An organization issued an exemption permit by the Department of Revenue Services (DRS) under Conn. Agencies Regs. §12-426-15, if the permit has not been canceled or revoked by DRS; or
- An organization that is exempt from federal income tax under I.R.C. §501(a) and has been issued a determination letter by the U.S. Treasury Department as an organization described in I.R.C. §501(c)(3) or (13), if the determination letter has not been revoked by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

A qualifying exempt organization may use this certificate to purchase any tangible personal property for resale at one of five fundraising or social events of a day's duration during any calendar year. The event must be exempt from tax under Conn. Gen. Stat. §12-412(94). Otherwise, exempt organizations are not allowed to purchase tangible personal property for resale with this certificate. See **Special Notice 98(11)**, Exemption From Sales and Use Taxes of Sales by Nonprofit Organizations at Fundraising or Social Events.

Purchases of Meals and Lodging: In general, qualifying exempt organizations may not use this certificate to purchase meals and lodging, but must get preapproval from DRS for these purchases, and use CERT-112, Exempt Purchases of Meals and Lodging by Exempt Entities, or CERT-123, Blanket Certificate for Exempt Qualifying Purchases of Meals or Lodging by an Exempt Entity.

However, a qualifying exempt organization may purchase meals tax exempt using this certificate, without prior approval from DRS, when it will resell the meals at one of five fundraising or social events per year exempt under Conn. Gen. Stat. §12-412(94). See Policy Statement 2003(4), Purchases of Meals of Lodging by Exempt Entities.

If the purchaser is not a qualifying exempt organization or does not use the property or services purchased exclusively for the purposes for which the organization was established, the purchaser owes use tax on the total purchase price of the property or services.

Statutory Authority: Conn. Gen. Stat. §12-412(8) and (94).

**Instructions for the Purchaser:** An officer of a qualifying exempt organization must issue and sign this certificate to advise the seller of tangible personal property or taxable services that sales and use taxes do not apply to the purchase. Keep a copy of this certificate, the documents attached, and records that substantiate the information entered on this certificate for at least six years from the date this certificate is issued.

The purchaser must attach to this certificate a copy of the:

- Exemption permit issued to the organization by DRS under Conn. Agencies Regs. §12-426-15; or
- Determination letter or group exemption letter issued by the IRS which establishes that the organization has been determined to be an exempt organization described in I.R.C. §501(c)(3) or (13).

For purchases made on or after January 1, 1996, a qualifying exempt organization covered by a group exemption letter, and that was **not** issued an exemption permit by DRS under Conn. Agencies Regs. §12-426-15, must attach to this certificate a copy of:

- The group exemption letter issued by the IRS to subordinate organizations (including the qualifying exempt organization) on whose behalf a central organization applied for recognition of exemption;
- The organization's written consent to the central organization to be covered by the group exemption letter; and
- The central organization's written notification to the IRS that the organization consents to be covered by the group exemption letter.

**Instructions for the Seller:** Acceptance of this certificate, when properly completed, relieves the seller from the burden of proving the sale and the storage, use, or consumption of the tangible personal property or taxable services are not subject to sales and use taxes. This certificate is valid only if taken in good faith from a qualifying exempt organization. The good faith of the seller will be questioned if the seller knows of facts that suggest the purchaser is not a qualifying exempt organization.

Keep this certificate, the documents attached, and bills or invoices to the purchaser for at least six years from the date the items or services were purchased. The bills, invoices or records covering the purchase made under this certificate must be marked "Exempt Under CERT-119" to indicate the purchase was exempt.

This certificate may be used for a single exempt purchase, in which case the box marked "Certificate for One Purchase Only" must be checked. This certificate may also be used for a continuing line of exempt purchases, in which case the box marked "Blanket Certificate" must be checked. A blanket certificate remains in effect for three years unless the purchaser revokes it in writing before the expiration of the three-year period. CERT-119 may not be used as a blanket certificate for purchases of tangible personal property for resale at any one of five fundraising or social events per calendar year exempt under Conn. Gen. Stat. §12-412(94).

An exempt organization must pay for its exempt purchases by a check drawn on its checking account or by a credit card issued in its name (and not in the name of any of its members or officers). An exempt organization may make a purchase of \$10 or less using cash from the organization's own funds. However, a blanket CERT-119 may not be used for a cash purchase, and a properly completed CERT-119, with the appropriate documents attached, must be issued to the retailer at the time of each cash purchase.

Looking ahead to Fortress Ukraine

With as many as 15,000 Russian troops dead, 30,000 Russian troops wounded or captured, 1,308 Russian tanks/armored vehicles destroyed, damaged or captured, and 79 Russian aircraft destroyed, Ukraine has won the Battle of Kiev and staggered Vladimir Putin's vaunted military. Even so, Putin has the capacity and callousness to keep bludgeoning Ukraine's cities - and Ukraine has the will and weaponry (thanks to NATO) to keep bleeding Russia's Yet at some point, this war will end. Let's stipulate that peace talks yield a free and independent Ukraine along the lines of what it was before Russia's invasion, with Crimea and a chunk of eastern Ukraine under Russian control. The next crucial step will be for the free world to help Ukraine ensure that Putin is never again tempted to repeat the mistake he made Feb. 24, 2022.

Reconstruction – likely to cost deep into the hundreds of billions – will be a key part of the effort to fend off another Russian invasion. As other post-conflict examples remind us, hollowed-out cities and broken infrastructure corrode nation-states from within, invite foreign interference (something Putin has illustrated time and again), and serve as breeding grounds for a host of transnational pathologies (human trafficking, drug smuggling, terrorism).

A modern-day Marshall Plan – led by the European Union, with support from the United States, Britain, Know your area's risk for thunderstorms. In most places they Canada, Turkey, Israel, Australia, Japan and others – can prevent that outcome by rebuilding what Putin's war of war crimes has destroyed. These donor nations would underwrite some of the costs of reconstruction, but ideally most of the costs of Ukraine's reconstruction should come from Russian assets. 
#### **Preparedness and Relief**

Thursday, May 12 at 3:45PM, The Veterans Athletes United (VAU) Global War on Terrorism Fallen Heroes Memorial will be escorted by 22 motorcycles from Shelton Police Department down Meadow St, to Perry Hill and then up Bridgeport Ave to Shelton Post 16. The memorial will be assembled at Sutter-Terlizzi American Legion Post 16 in Shelton. The memorial will be available for viewing by the public from 11AM Friday May 13th until 7PM on Sunday the 15th.

This 28-foot wide by 6-foot tall American Flag symbolizes the shape of the flag when draped on a fallen service members casket. It is formed of approximately 7000 dog tags of all those who have fallen in the War on Terror. There are 50 gold stars honoring all gold star families nationwide. Displayed in front of the flag is a battle field cross sculpted from mahogany wood by veteran artist Alicia Dietz.

Tags are in alphabetical order ranging from 11SEPT 2001 to 31Dec 2019; thereafter the tags are in chronological order of the date Killed in Action (KIA). Sadly, as the war continues, they will continue to fill in the blank tags at the end of the flag.

The opening ceremony will be Friday the 13th at 6PM and will begin with Amy LaReau Battaglia singing The National Anthem followed by a welcoming address and reading the names of the Valley's Global War on Terrorism Casualties, Army First Lieutenant Thomas J. Brown of Shelton and Army Sergeant David Travis Friedrich of Naugatuck, as wreaths are placed in their memory followed by a rifle salute and taps.

The closing ceremonies will be on Sunday the 15th at 5PM and will include the reading of the names of the 65 Connecticut Global War on Terrorism Casualties, while girl scouts from Troop 60481 place a flag for each casualty in their memory and present a flower to each Gold Star Family in attendance, followed by a rifle salute and taps. Post 16 will be assisted during closing ceremonies by the 198th Army Band. The band is based in Rochester NY and is part of the 99th Readiness Division. The soldiers who make up the reserve band are from all over the country and play their instruments in addition to their full time job. The 198th Band connects the public to the Army by telling the Army story and honoring our Soldiers and Veterans as musical ambassadors.

Post 16, with financial assistance from the Valley Community Foundation is bringing the Fallen Heroes Memorial to Shelton as a way to honor the Soldiers, Sailors, Airman and Marines whose names are on the Memorial, as well as the loved ones, and comrades in arms that they left behind.

Counselors from the New Haven VetCenter will be available on site during the day for those who wish to talk; however, security will be on site 24/7 to allow those who prefer to visit in the evening a quiet time to reflect. Visitors are urged to carpool if possible.






