My Fellow Legionnaires,

If you have any concerns with the slate, be prepared to nominate members from the floor at your election meeting that you feel will better lead your Post into the future. If you have ever considered pursuing a Post leadership position, remember any member in good standing is eligible to serve in a leadership position.

Post Commanders and Adjutants should have already submitted your Post Data Forms and should be ready to file your Consolidated Post Report. You should also be preparing the Election of Post Officers Form, Commander/Adjutant Form, Certification of Service Record and Post Committee Reports. These documents are required to be submitted immediately following your elections, even if there are no changes in positions. The fillable version of these forms can be found on the Department website, www.ctlegion.org.

As we continue to recover from this past year, I wish everyone is doing well. Please keep it touch with members on your Sick Call list and be prepared to lend a hand or your support where needed.

#### Senate Bill 263 (An Act Concerning Club Permit and Non-Profit Club Permit Fees)

Congratulations, we did it, SB263 passed, and the Governor has signed it into law. What does this mean to our Post throughout the State? If your post held a club license and paid \$300.00 annually, then you will revert to that fee. If your Post held a Non-Profit Club License and paid \$815.00 annually, then you will revert to that fee.

Revised bills were sent out on May 14, 2021 and all Posts should have received them by now. If you haven't received a new bill, please call the Liquor Commission immediately as you may have trouble getting deliveries from vendors while you get it straightened out.

#### Post & District Election and Committee Forms

Posts and Districts Should have received their annual election and committee paperwork the first week of May. It is imperative that you send these forms back to Department Headquarters as soon as possible so we can ensure that National has the correct information on file. This will ensure that incoming officers will have access to the new My Legion in a timely manner so they can perform their required duties and as we all know the new My Legion has many issues that are being worked, so let's not add to the problem.

#### Post Data Forms

Thank you to all the Posts who have already submitted these forms, but there are still many Posts who have not submitted their forms. These forms are even more critical with the new My Legion database, we need to make sure that National has your current information on file.

#### Consolidated Post Reports & Consolidated Squadron Reports

Post CPR forms have been mailed and are available on the Department website, many Posts have either sent in their CPR or are filling them out on the National website in My Legion. The Squadron CPR form is a fillable document and is available on the Department website, it can be downloaded or filled out online and sent to Department Headquarters. The SAL CPR will not be mailed this year. All **CPR** Forms must be in Department HQ by June 3<sup>rd</sup>.




