Comrades,

As of May 26th, 2022, the Department of Connecticut is in 25th place nationally and 8<sup>th</sup> place in the Northeast Division at 93.19%, which also reflects a renewal rate of 91.78%. Looking at the big picture, we need 1,114 cards to attain 100% membership for the current membership year. Being extremely realistic, I don't see us making the 100% goal this year. As chairman of the commission, I would personally consider this to be a good & productive year, if we can hit the 95% mark or better by our Department Convention, and then continue to strive upwards leading into the National Convention. This goal is very much achievable, as long as all Post continue to contact the non-renewed members, and process them immediately, without holding back- with the new cards being made available for the 2023 membership year. All year long we've been encouraging the Posts to start going after the Post 200 members immediately to try to transfer them into a local Post, and try to get them to pay their dues to the local Post, or worse case to at least renew their dues with Post 200, if they have not done so yet. This is a vital piece of the puzzle for the Department of Connecticut.

At this time, same as last month, I'm highly encouraging every District within the Department to fully utilize their respective District officers and directly work with Posts within your District to concentrate on Post renewals, as well as fully working the Post 200 listings for the members that have not renewed this year. I'm asking all Districts to be directly involved with every Post in your District, using a face to face and hands on approach to working the membership. In my travels around the Department, I'm always hearing that a phone call was made or an email was sent to the under achieving Posts, and then nothing further is said or happens. What I'm asking of the District leadership, is to reach out to the Post, and find out "when" the Post is willing to have a District officer meet with and assist them in making direct contact with the non-renewed members, as well as consider working the Post 200 roster. The numbers are there and are attainable for the department of Connecticut to achieve 95% percent prior to the Department convention, which equates to needing 296 cards. Yes, it does take a little work and strong effort, but keep in mind that working membership truly is and can be a lot of fun. Please feel free to contact myself, Department Headquarters, or any commission member, if you need anything. We are all here to assist and support each and every one of you to the best of our ability.

In closing, I just want to sincerely thank each and every one of you for all that you do, and for your time & commitment to this great organization. This is my very last bulletin message to the Department as the Chairman of the Membership, Leadership & Learning Commission. I've held this position for almost 12 years now, and it time to turn the helm over to someone else. I will still be around, so please don't hesitate to contact me, if there is ever anything I can assist you with. I hope that everyone remains healthy and safe, as well as your families. I look forward to seeing and speaking with everyone at the Department Convention in July.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING IRS & INCORPORATION REQUIREMENTS

This message is for all Posts in the Department of Connecticut. As many of you already know I have been working on verifying EIN#'s and Incorporation status for all Posts in the state. It has been a lengthy process and I am close to completing my goal. It is important that all of you understand that it is a requirement for all Posts to have a valid EIN# and are Incorporated through the State. It doesn't matter how big or small your Post is, if you own property or not, if your active or not, if you meet or don't meet, the requirement is the same.

The hard cold truth is that if you fail to meet these requirements your Post charter can and may be cancelled for failing to operate as a legal entity under Department and National rules and the IRS and State guidelines concerning non-profit veteran organizations. While we exist to support our fellow veteran's, we must also recognize that our Posts must be treated as a business and as such you are required to file certain paperwork on an annual basis. Several of our Posts have canteens, paid employees, paid volunteers etc. and are required to pay various federal and state taxes and in order in to accomplish this you must have a valid EIN #. The type of 990 you file will depend on your Post income, if you have any property, or investments etc.

We currently have 29 Posts (25%) with a suspended EIN #, this number has dropped over the past couple of years as I have been working with several Posts to get their EIN #'s reinstated. This means you cannot fundraise, accept donations and in some cases subject to fines levied by the IRS.

We currently have 72 Posts (50%) who are not currently incorporated, meaning you have either never filed or haven't filed in several years. This means your members are not protected from a lawsuit or other actions taken against the post. The State is finally catching up with and is now dissolving businesses who continue not file their annual reports.

If you think you are one of these Posts, then you probably are and you need to contact my office as soon as possible so we can start the process of getting you back on track. There is a financial requirement to be reinstated and I know some Posts don't have much in the way of funds, but the alternative is to have your Post charter cancelled.

Post insurance is another area of concern as we have many Posts who are not insured. It is highly recommended that all Posts carry some sort of insurance especially if you own a building. If you don't own a building, then you should be carrying some sort of liability insurance especially if you meet in a facility owned by someone else. All Posts should be bonding their officers to protect against any type of theft, you may think it will never happen to your post, but we all know this is not the case.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All Posts, please read below. We periodically receive calls about why we are not sales tax exempt; well things have changed! Below you will find that 501(c)19 organizations are included in the state statues. What does this mean for our Legion Posts, you will now be able to claim sales tax exemption when making purchases that qualify under the below section. Please pay close attention to the RED highlighted section as this is especially important, you must have either the original or a copy of your determination letter from the IRS and CERT-119 to receive sales tax exemption and this MUST be done for each purchase. I have put the CERT-119 form in this bulletin vou can download it at https://portal.ct.gov/-/media/DRS/Forms/1-2018/Certificates/CERT119pdf.pdf If you have questions PLEASE contact me and I will walk you through it.

#### AN ACT CONCERNING A SALES TAX EXEMPTION FOR VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly:

Section 1. Subdivision (8) of section 12-412 of the 2008 supplement to the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (8) Sales of tangible personal property or services to any organization that is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or any veterans' organization that is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501 (c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or any subsequent corresponding internal revenue code of the United States, as from time to time amended, and that the United States Treasury Department has expressly determined, by letter, to be an organization that is described in Section 501(c)(3) or (13) of said internal revenue code. At the time of the sale that is exempt under this subsection, the organization shall, in order to qualify for said exemption, do one of the following: (A) Present to the retailer (i) a copy of the United States Treasury Department determination letter that was issued to such organization, and (ii) a certificate, in such form as the commissioner may prescribe, certifying that a United States Treasury Department determination letter has been issued to such organization and has not been revoked and that the tangible personal property or services that are being purchased from the retailer by such organization are to be used or consumed exclusively for the purposes for which such organization was established, or (B) present to the retailer (i) a copy of the exemption permit that was issued pursuant to this subsection by the commissioner to such organization before July 1, 1995, after a determination of eligibility by the commissioner, and (ii) a certificate, in such form as the commissioner may prescribe, certifying that an exemption permit was issued pursuant to this subsection by the commissioner to such organization before July 1, 1995, and was not revoked and that the tangible personal property or services that are being purchased from the retailer by such organization are to be used or consumed exclusively for the purposes for which the organization was established. The organization shall be liable for the tax otherwise imposed if such tangible personal property or services are not used or consumed exclusively for the purposes for which the organization was established.

If your post has not sponsored a high school student to Boys State before, please consider doing it this year. The program will be in person this year and held at the **Trumbull Marriott Hotel** 180 Hawley Ln, Trumbull, CT 06611 from **June 25 thru June 30, 2022**. Due to numerous unforeseen circumstances and some operational concerns, we are not able to secure a date to hold this year's program. We apologize for the late notification and if you have already sent in an application the money will be returned and we will keep the individual's application for next year's program.

#### **New Post and District Officers**

Please submit the forms for the Post/District Officers immediately after election to Department Headquarters, do not wait until installation. If you have committee chairman already assigned, you can send us that information as well. Hard copies of these forms will be in the pre-convention mailer, and you can also download the fillable version on our website <a href="www.ctlegion.org">www.ctlegion.org</a> if that makes it easier for you.

#### 2023 Membership Cards

2023 membership cards will be available for pickup at your district meetings in June. For those posts who don't normally attend, you may want to come and pick them up, otherwise you will have to make arrangements with the district commander. We have new officer and adjutant manuals available at Department Headquarters, districts can pick them and disburse, or posts can make arrangements with us directly.

#### Consolidated Post Reports & Consolidated Squadron Reports

All posts/squadrons need to fill out and send in your reports. You can enter your information on the CPR manually or enter your data (directly to National) via myLegion.org. You can download the fillable versions on our website <a href="https://www.ctlegion.org">www.ctlegion.org</a> All CPR Forms must be in Department HQ by June 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### **Department Convention**

Department Convention is fast approaching, this year's convention will be held on July 8,9 & 10, 2022, at the Trumbull Marriott Hotel. Your Post should have already received the 60-day mailer. We will be mailing out the 30-day mailer and all other forms the beginning on June 9, 2022, so be on the lookout.

#### Please copy and share all Bulletin information as widely as possible!

Posts and Districts make sure that you have all required forms filled out and sent back to Department Headquarters by the required deadlines.

Remember, if you are registering the morning of convention only the Commander, Adjutant or duly appointed representative can register the Post. If you have someone designated, they must have a signed letter from the Post Commander authorizing them to register the delegation otherwise you will have to register as a guest.

#### **National Convention**

The American Legion's 103<sup>rd</sup> National Convention will take place in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, August 26 – September 1, 2022, the registration forms have been posted on our department website <a href="https://www.ctlegion.org">www.ctlegion.org</a> If you are interested in being a delegate, get with your district leadership and find out how you can become a delegate. If you have never been to a National Convention and would like to be a guest, you can contact our office to find out the details. All delegates, alternates and call-ins MUST be registered and stay in official convention housing, delegates who choose not to stay in official convention housing will not receive the per diem. All guests must be registered through the Department Adjutant, if you are an auxiliary member and are a delegate or alternate you must contact Auxiliary headquarters for instructions.




