Fellow Legionnaires,

As we close out this year, I have learned much from my travels to National, and our districts and posts around the Department.

I've met some terrific Legionnaires, who give much of their time, effort and even their own money to continue the mission of The American Legion, as well as support our Four Pillars. They have made this a positive year for me, and these members belong to the most successful posts in Connecticut.

I am also sorely disappointed in the finish to our membership numbers in the department. One of our Pillars is support of veterans and their families, and one of the most effective ways is through Buddy Checks. This is a connection to members (and veterans) of the Legion, which helps those who may not have the time or the ability to attend meetings and/or post activities. It reminds them that we have their back and are there for them. Two major lessons I learned this past year that I leave for the future.

The first is that Buddy Checks should begin in July. Even if your Post does not meet in the summer, contact your members, make sure they are doing well, and be sure they have the schedule of any events the post has planned for the summer and fall months. If you have your own post, have a coffee hour, where members can come in and just sit and enjoy each other's company. If you don't have a post home, meet somewhere to relax, and just shoot the breeze...take advantage of the warm weather. By starting Buddy Checks now, the members will be reminded of dues when they receive their renewal notices.

The second lesson learned is that each district should schedule a revitalization in September. These calls can be a combined "dues owed" reminder, as well as reminding members of meetings and post activities being held in the fall/winter. In addition, districts need to take advantage of training opportunities offered by our Membership, Leadership & Learning sub-committee, led by a future leader Mike Kellett. Schedule a training topic for your district meetings, just a 15-minute review of a topic that is suggested by a district officer or member.

I will leave you with this reminder: engage your membership and have fun doing so. We are all volunteers, and if we are not having fun, what is the point? Challenge each other, whether posts or districts and share all ideas that work for your membership drives. They may not work for everyone, but if someone benefits, we all win. I look forward to seeing you all in future years.

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

1. Large-scale aerial drills are underway again over the Korean Peninsula, nearly a month after South Korea carried out similar training with the United States. More than 60 South Korean aircraft are taking part in the weeklong, biannual Soaring Eagle exercise that kicked off Friday. It consists of aerial combat scenarios, ground-to-air missile simulations and aerial refueling training, according to a Ministry of National Defense news release.

2. China sentenced a 78-year-old United States citizen to life in prison Monday on spying charges, in a case that could exacerbate the deterioration in ties between Beijing and Washington over recent years. Details of the charges against John Shing-Wan Leung, who also holds permanent residency in Hong Kong, have not been publicly released.

3. Defense budget work on Capitol Hill remains halted until Congress finds a compromise on the looming debt limit crisis. House Armed Services Committee members were supposed to begin public work on their initial draft of the annual defense authorization bill last week, but Republican leaders halted those plans until sometime next month. Senate lawmakers similarly have pushed back the defense policy work until mid-June, after they see what political deals are made in the next few weeks.

4. President Volodymyr Zelenskyy was in Britain Monday on his whirlwind European tour, as the staunch ally of Kyiv promised to give Ukraine hundreds more missiles and attack drones in an effort to change the course of the war. Zelenskyy landed by helicopter at Chequers, the British leader's official country retreat, and was greeted by Prime Minister Rishi Sunak. It's Zelenskyy's second trip to the U.K. since Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022.

5. American investors plan to develop facilities at a former U.S. naval base in the Philippines that could include the installation's airport, according to Philippine government news outlet. Cerberus Capital Management, a New York-based private equity firm, took control of a large shipyard in Subic Bay last year. Eight hundred Philippine navy sailors are now stationed in part of the installation, the government-run Philippine News Agency reported Friday.

FROM THE LANDING ZONE:

Amid Ukraine war, Poland becomes critical U.S. ally

Thrust to the frontlines of Cold War II by Vladimir Putin's invasion of Ukraine, Poland is taking its place as an essential cog in the NATO alliance, a major contributor to the common defense and a key U.S. ally.

Prior to February 2022, Putin attacked and occupied swaths of Georgia and Ukraine, threatened nuclear strikes against Norway, conducted cyberattacks against America's energy infrastructure and food-supply infrastructure, waged cyberwar against Estonia, shut off natural-gas flows to Ukraine, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Greece, Italy, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia and Turkey, attempted a violent coup aimed at preventing Montenegro from joining NATO, and trained his sights on Poland.

Poland will "know what it means to be in the crosshairs," Putin growled after his seizure of Crimea. Russian forces have practiced amphibious invasions of <u>Poland</u>, complete with mock nuclear strikes. Putin has based hypersonic missiles and sea-skimming antiship missiles in Kaliningrad, a Russian exclave bordering

Poland. He recently announced plans to deploy nuclear weapons in Belarus. Indeed, for more than decade, Putin and his puppet state in Belarus have launched "snap" military exercises along and near Poland's borders. These are highly threatening and destabilizing. Recall that a Russian exercise in Belarus in early February 2022 served as springboard to the Feb. 24 invasion of Ukraine.

Poland is in the process of more than doubling its land forces to 300,000 personnel. Plus, the Polish Defense Ministry has launched Train with the Army, a nationwide effort to equip and prepare the civilian population for territorial defense in the event that Putin attempts in Poland what he's done in Ukraine and Georgia.

"We are perceived as those who guarantee security on NATO's eastern flank," said Poland's Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki. "Our efforts to strengthen the army through arms purchases go hand-in-hand with strengthening NATO's presence on the eastern flank."For more of the story visit: <u>https://www.legion.org/</u>landingzone

Disaster Preparedness and Relief

Hurricanes are dangerous and can cause major damage from storm surge, wind damage, rip currents and flooding. They can happen along any U.S. coast or in any territory in the Atlantic or Pacific oceans. Storm surge historically is the leading cause of hurricanerelated deaths in the United States.

Now is the time to prepare yourself and your household for the upcoming Atlantic hurricane season. During Hurricane Preparedness Week, assess your personal risk, update your family's emergency communications plan, start to replenish your emergency kit, and review your personal and financial documents.

Hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30, but the time to prepare is now when you are not under pressure as storms form in the Atlantic. If you wait until a hurricane is approaching, the odds are that you will be under duress and might not make the best decision.

Hurricanes are not just a coastal problem. Find out how rain, wind, water and even tornadoes could happen far inland from where a hurricane or tropical storm makes landfall. <u>Start preparing now</u>.

Make sure everyone in your household knows and understands your hurricane plans. Include the office, kids' day care, and anywhere else you frequent in your hurricane plans. Ensure your business has a continuity plan to continue operating when disaster strikes.

Recognize Warnings and Alerts. Have several ways to receive alerts. <u>Download the FEMA app</u> and receive real-time alerts from the National Weather Service for up to five locations nationwide. <u>Sign up for community alerts</u> in your area and be aware of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) and Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA), which require no sign up. Dear Friends of Veterans,

While attending the 100th Anniversary of the American Legion at the Capitol Building in Hartford, CT, I passed through a long hallway, known as the Hall of Honor. I noticed pictures of service members from Connecticut who had been killed in the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts. After paying respects to these brave heroes, I searched the walls for a memorial to those who gave their lives while serving in Vietnam, hoping to find the name of a fallen friend.

Although other items were on display recognizing veterans, there was no memorial for the 616 service members killed in Vietnam. Unable to find the memorial, I asked where it might be located and was informed there wasn't one in the Capitol Building. Shortly after, I began investigating how to have a memorial, honoring those 616 service members from Connecticut, included with the other veterans honored and remembered there.


With the help of State Representative John-Michael Parker, American Legion Post 79 and others, it was decided that 3 plaques with the name, branch of service, and hometown of each of these heroes would be included in the Hall of Honor. So far, through the generosity of some local veterans, and organizations, we have raised \$1300. We need around \$8,000 to complete the project.
