Post Convention

NO SMOKING IN POST BARS

As of October 1, 2021, you will no longer be allowed to smoke in any public building, restaurant, or bar, this includes Veteran organizations. Senate Bill 1201 (An Act Concerning Responsible and Equitable Regulation of Adult-Use Cannabis) passed in a June Special Session and was signed by Governor Lamont. This bill closes all the loopholes that previously allowed our Posts to remain smoking if they so choose and now due to the legalization of Cannabis this is no longer an option.

All Posts needs to prepare to become non-smoking by October 1, 2021, which will include posting signs to let people know they cannot smoke within 25 feet of your building. Whether your Post has a bar or not you will have to figure out where you can set up a smoking area for those who wish to smoke, or you can ban smoking all together.

For those Posts who were already thinking about going non-smoking and were meeting resistance from your members, this is your opportunity to move your Post forward and hopefully encourage those members who didn't want to come around because of the smoke environment. This is an opportunity to let those Veterans in your town who are not members because you were a smoking Post and encourage them to join.

If you have questions, please contact our office to make sure you are getting the correct information!!

Post Officer Forms

Please ensure that you send in your Post election forms in a timely manner as these along with the Commander/Adjutant form are still required, regardless if you are keeping the same officers for the upcoming year. We use these to update our Post contact information on the Department Website.

Post Data Forms

We still have several Posts that have not turned in their Post Data forms, these are important to both the Department and National as the information is used to set your Post dues, change contact information, and update any other changes that you submit.

Please copy and share all Bulletin information as widely as possible!

Consolidated Post Reports & Consolidated Squadron Reports

CPR's for Posts and Squadrons have been sent and many of you have sent them back, but we are still lacking any reports from numerous Posts. If you prefer, you may download a fillable version from our website or request it via email, which you then may save on your computer. Electronic versions <u>must be returned to Department HQ (NOT National)</u> via email (or snail mail).

Membership Cards

All Posts should have their 2021 Legion membership cards and your SAL membership cards, if this is not the case, please contact our office immediately.

PUFL & Online Credits

PUFL and Online credits should be available by September 1, 2020, once we have the breakdown of how much each Post will get you can then start to use the monies for membership processing. For those Posts who process their own membership we will send you a check.

GET THEM THERE!



Take advantage of the nice weather and schedule a summer picnic open house. Nothing over the top but something family friendly, hamburgers, hotdogs, soft drinks, etc. Maybe have some kid games, face painting or inflatables. Advertise that it is a FREE event open to all veterans and their families as a thank you for their service.

PROMOTE YOUR POST!

Now that they are there the next step is to promote your post. What do I mean by promoting your post? Promote the American Legion and its programs. This is where those darn Consolidated Post Reports come in handy. Make up a informational sheet outlining all of the programs that your post offered and participated in, including the number served, hours committed and monies involved. Always include information on Children and Youth programs, this is especially important to our younger veterans with families. Outline the community events that you sponsor such as summer lunch programs, blood drives, food distribution, etc. If you have partnerships with local businesses and organizations let that be known. Have information available which show the benefits of belonging to the American Legion.

Make sure that your post is clean and organized as appearance is a big factor. Remember you want this to be a family friendly and safe environment. Make sure that you have members present that know about your post and the programs offered. Pre-planning is a plus, Set up membership tables inside and outside and make sure that they are highly visible! Ensure that you have plenty of applications and additional information available.

DO NOT promote the canteen (bar)! This area is not the American Legion, it is a business which generates revenue which assists the post in providing the programs and to keep the lights on and explain it as such.




