My Fellow Legionnaires

By now you have received your membership quota for the year, but I strongly urge you not to “settle” for that number. Just as we should strive to do our absolute best in life, we should look to this number as a start.

The summer and Fall are a perfect time to conduct Buddy Checks, especially with our most vulnerable members i.e., older veterans living alone, those we do not see often, if at all, and those who live out of state. Let them know we are there to assist them in any way we can, even if we just chat on the phone for a while.

One tool we learned out at the National Membership workshops this past month, was to follow up with new members or transfers. The commander, adjutant or membership team should call this new member within seven days. Make sure they know when the next meeting will be held, and when they attend the meeting, introduce them, ask them to speak of their service, family, and life. You may be pleasantly surprised at what they offer. At this same meeting, be sure other members greet them and sit with them. After the meeting, ask them to if they have any questions about what they saw and heard during the meeting. Do not look to give them an officer’s position or other assignments at first, you will most assuredly “lose them.”

Post Commanders, think about a welcome packet for new members. Whether it is a new member kit, a Legion “Thank You for Your Service” coin, or just an informational letter that lets them know when the Post meets, various events you sponsor and Legion programs that you may run, this will make them feel more involved, without asking for a commitment. Ensure they have at least one Post contact number to call for questions or information. You may even hold an Initiation for any member who has not participated in this tradition. How many members of your Post have been initiated?

Remember, I am only a text, call or email away. Please don’t hesitate to contact me for any help or ideas.

National Security News

Back to the future for NATO, By Alan W. Dowd.

NATO has unveiled a new Strategic Concept – a kind of mission statement for the 30-member alliance ([soon to be 32-member alliance](#)). The 2022 Strategic Concept is the first overhaul of NATO’s mission statement in a dozen years. Tellingly, the document has much more in common with NATO’s posture during its first four decades than that of the 1990s and early 2000s.

Yesterday NATO has relied on Strategic Concepts to guide alliance operations and deployments – and signal alliance adversaries – since its founding in 1949. Strategic Concepts have evolved as times and threats change, but all are premised on deterring war. As Lord Hastings Ismay, NATO’s first secretary-general, explained, “The paramount, the permanent, the all-absorbing business of NATO is to avoid war.”

The new Strategic Concept vows to “deter and defend forward with robust in-place, multi-domain, combat-ready forces, enhanced command and control arrangements, prepositioned ammunition and equipment, and improved capacity and infrastructure to rapidly reinforce any ally.” Here, the alliance borrows from the 1952 Strategic Concept’s commitment to enhance the quality and quantity of weapons systems NATO-wide, as well as the 1966 document’s commitment to “forward defense.”

To enhance NATO’s deterrent posture, the new Strategic Concept directs allies to “increase the alignment of national and NATO defense plans ... strengthen and modernize the NATO force structure ... (and) enhance the collective readiness, responsiveness, deployability, integration and interoperability of our forces.” NATO’s leaders warn, “No one should doubt our strength and resolve to defend every inch of allied territory.” In this, the alliance is repeating the 1966 Strategic Concept’s warning against Moscow gambling with “the threat or use of military force against any part of the North Atlantic Treaty area.”

The new Strategic Concept recognizes that the threats to NATO are not confined to Europe – and that the Kremlin is not the sole source of threats.

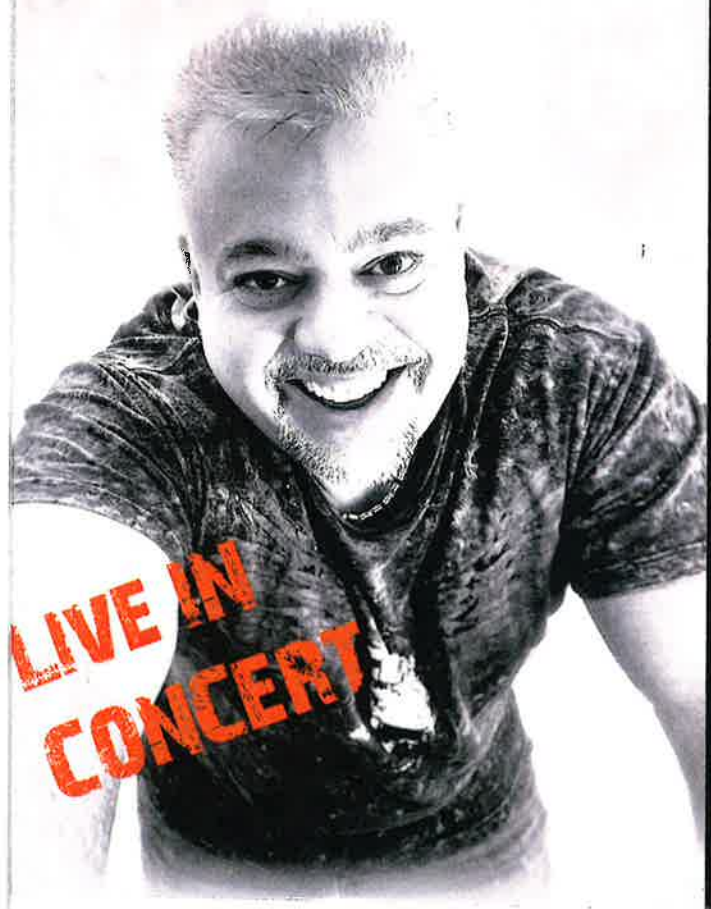

Bell made in 1837 may find its way to Quinlan Park

BRISTOL – American Legion Post 209 is working to bring a bell made in 1837 by Hartford’s Doolittle Clock and Bell Factory to Quinlan Park just in time for this year’s Veterans Day ceremony.

Brian Avery, commander of American Legion Post 209, said that the bell was donated to the Legion by the family of Frank Owsianko, of Forestville, who died in 1996.

“It belonged to a gentleman whose father used to own Frank’s Stationary and Variety, where 150 Central is now,” said Avery. “He got the bell at least 40 years ago and used to carry it down the street in a flatbed during the Forestville Parade. It had been sitting in a shed for 25 years as the family tried to figure out what to do with it. They approached me and said they’d like to have it used to honor veterans at Quinlan Park.”

Avery said that he is working with Pepin Steel of Bristol to come up with designs for how to properly mount the historic bell. On Jan. 20, he will be meeting with the city’s Park Board to give them pictures of the bell and discuss plans for how it will be displayed at Quinlan Park.

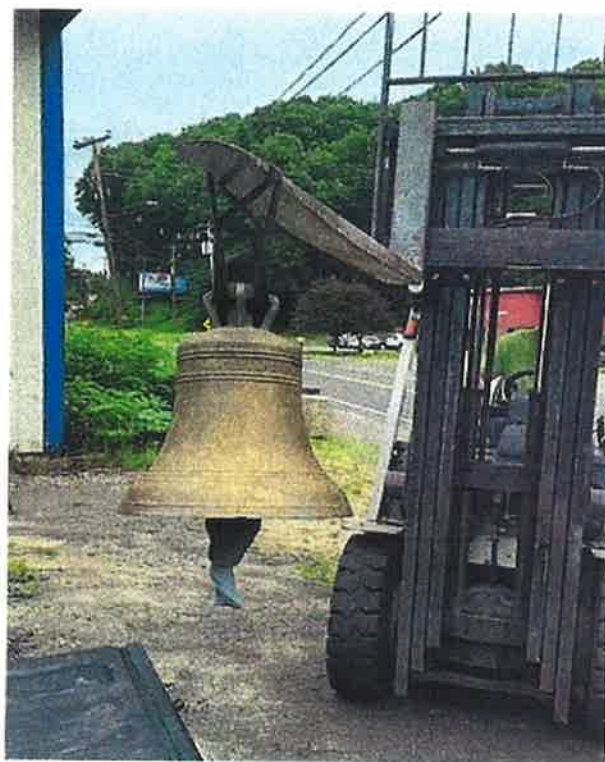
“This is a unique piece of history, that should not be sitting in a shed, collecting dust,” said Avery. “There are a lot of people related to the Doolittle family in Bristol who are very excited about it. I feel like it will be used to enhance our services at Quinlan Park as we honor, respect and remember those that gave the ultimate sacrifice for God and Country.”

Avery said he believes that the bell was once used in a local church.
