My fellow delegates and I have just returned from Charlotte, NC where we were honored to represent the Department of Connecticut at 104<sup>th</sup> American Legion National Convention. We have returned to Connecticut with a refreshed sense of purpose and motivation to do the work of our great veteran service organization! Our greatest task now, is to pass that motivation on to the rest of the almost 15,000 veterans that make up The American Legion, Department of Connecticut.

A recurring theme of the National Convention was The American Legion's "Be The One" initiative. To quote our national website, "The program will destignatize asking for mental health support, provide peer-to-peer support and resources, and educate everyone on how they can Be the One." With suicide being one of the top concerns facing the veteran community, I ask each one of you to go to <a href="www.legion.org/betheone">www.legion.org/betheone</a> to learn more about how you can "Be The One" to save the life of one of your brother or sister veterans.

As I travel and speak to posts and districts this year, you will repeatedly hear me encourage our members to consider purchasing a Paid Up For Life (P.U.F.L.) membership before the end of the 2023 – 2024 membership year. Both the Department and National have dues increases taking effect July 1, 2024, for a combined increase of \$10.00. By purchasing a P.U.F.L. membership now, you can lock in your current dues rate and avoid ever seeing dues increase again. The American Legion P.U.F.L. program is not a discounted life membership like you may see in some other organizations. It is simply an advanced payment of your lifetime dues based upon your age. Lastly, at the National Executive Committee meeting held at the conclusion of the National Convention, I witnessed two things happen that made me extremely proud to be a Legionnaire from the Department of Connecticut. # **National votes to raise Membership Dues**

All, a resolution to raise membership dues was introduced at the National Convention and after much discussion, it was ultimately passed. What does this mean for everyone moving forward? Dues will increase by \$10.00 starting July 1, 2024; Posts will be required to submit their Post Data forms in March 2024 reflecting their new Post dues with a minimum of \$39.50. Posts will need to determine what if any additional dues they will add to that amount. We had initially been told that the dues increase would happen in two years, but even with budget cuts it was not enough to offset the need for additional revenue. Membership is the key to everything we do as an organization and if we want to remain viable well into the future, we need to continue to promote our organization and all that we do for Veterans. Please encourage eligible veterans to join our organization and explain our programs and how we benefit not only veterans, but our local communities.

### FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

- 1. The Army's recruitment numbers were so dire in the fall that country singer Craig Morgan turned to his friend, Sen. Marsha Blackburn, and told her that he wanted to reenlist. There was one problem: At 58, the Army veteran was only a few years away from the military's mandatory retirement age of 62. So Blackburn, then a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, decided to step in and help. She began working with the Defense Department and the Army, pressing them to allow Morgan to step back into uniform. It worked.
- 2. Marine 1st Lt. Harvey "Barney" Barnum jumped to the ground when he came under fire during an ambush in Vietnam that killed his radio operator and commander. Collecting himself, Barnum realized he was now the highest-ranking officer of a rifle company he'd just joined. He called in artillery and, amid gunfire, dragged the commander to safety, where he died in Barnum's arms. Then he proceeded to mount a counterattack, oversee evacuation of the wounded and lead the unit's eventual break out to rejoin the battalion. The Medal of Honor recipient, now 83, watched Saturday as his wife smashed a bottle of sparkling wine against the bow to christen the future U.S. Navy destroyer that'll bear the name Harvey C. Barnum Jr.
- 3. U.S. and South Korean warships conducted an anti-submarine drill south of the Korean Peninsula over the weekend in response to North Korea's "escalating" missile tests. The USS Annapolis, a Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine, joined South Korea's Aegisequipped Yulgok Yi destroyer and the Yi Sun-sin submarine south of Jeju Island to strengthen their response to the North Korean missiles and underwater threats, the ministry said in a news release
- 4. Russian missiles slammed into an apartment complex and a university building in the central Ukrainian city of Kryvyi Rih, killing four people and wounding dozens of others Monday as the blasts trapped residents beneath rubble, Ukraine's interior minister said. One of the two missiles destroyed a section of the apartment building between the fourth and ninth floors, Interior Minister Ihor Klymenko said. Video showed black smoke billowing from corner units and burned out or damaged cars on a tree-lined street.
- 5. The U.S. military on Okinawa is cleaning up, battening down and making ready for Typhoon Khanun's expected arrival Wednesday morning. The storm, with the strength of a Category 4 hurricane, is expected to pass 64 miles southwest of Kadena Air Base around 5 a.m. Wednesday, the 18th Wing Weather Flight said by email Friday.

### FROM THE LANDING ZONE:

U.S., allies work to deter Korean War II, By Alan W. Dowd. As of July 27, the Korean War armistice has held for 70 years – thanks only to the deterrent strength and steely restraint of the U.S.-ROK alliance. The bad news is that North Korea is severely testing that restraint. The good news is that there appears to be a renewed commitment to deterrence in Seoul and Washington. High stakes and a low bar Let's start with the bad news, which emanates from North Korea.

With its growing nuclear arsenal, spasms of missile tests and unpredictable leadership, North Korea has put South Korea, Japan and the United States on edge. In 2022, Pyongyang test-fired more than 90 missiles, including 23 on a single day. Pyongyang has fired off dozens more this year, including ICBM launches in April and July.

Recall that Pyongyang has a terrifying vision to turn Seoul into "a sea of fire," "sink" Japan "into the sea," and "reduce the U.S. mainland into ashes" - and a nuclear arsenal to make that vision a reality. Indeed, the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute reports that North Korea now has 30 nuclear weapons – five more than it deployed in 2022.

Words and actions By word and deed, Seoul and Washington are taking the North Korean threat seriously.

"A nuclear attack by North Korea against the United States or its allies and partners is unacceptable, and will result in the end of whatever regime were to take such an action," President Joe Biden bluntly declared during an April summit with South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol. A post-summit declaration soberly reaffirmed that "U.S. commitment to extend deterrence to the ROK is backed by the full range of U.S. capabilities, including nuclear." ### **Disaster Preparedness and Relief**

The American Legion Blood Donor Program has existed officially since 1942 to help that cause. Each year departments coordinate efforts at the post level. The Blood Donor Program honors those departments that best participate in blood-donation efforts, recognizing departments for post participation and individual

Legionnaire participation.

Legionnaires participate by giving blood and reporting it to their posts, which mark the donation on their annual C.P.R.s. Similarly, posts that host blood drives mark their participation on their

C.P.R.s, listing number of drives held and total pints donated.

Posts interested in hosting drives can set up a blood drive by visiting the Red Cross' blood drive registration page. You do not need a Post Home to run a drive. Many post partner with local churches, other VSO's and their local towns. Blood drives require staffing and publicity as well as space.

Basic requirements for hosing a blood drive include: 2,200 square feet and more area to hold the drive, heating and air must be able to be at 68 degrees, no stairs, easy load in and out with ramps level at grade. Electrical outlets, and cleared space. The post will also need 6 to 10 folding tables as well as a couple dozen chairs. Three or four volunteers will be needed to help setup and breakdown as well assist during the drive.
