Your attention is called to the following two (2) Constitutional Amendments adopted by the 1949 Department Convention.

Posts are hereby notified that any Constitutional Amendments or Resolutions, binding as American Legion Policy upon the Department or its Posts, MUST BE SUBMITTED at least sixty (60) days prior to the opening of the Department Convention... MAY 7, 2016 to Department Headquarters. Department Headquarters will furnish the required electronic form to any Post or individual upon request.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE XIV: SECTION 1

"This Constitution may be amended at any Department Convention by the vote of two thirds (2/3) of the total authorized representation thereat, provided that the proposed amendment shall have been presented in writing to the Department Executive Committee at least sixty (60) days before the opening of the Convention and a copy thereof transmitted to each Post at least thirty (30) days prior to such Convention."

ARTICLE V: SECTION 10, b

"Any resolution which it is proposed to submit to the Department Convention, shall, if after passage it is to be binding as American Legion Policy upon the Department or its constituent Posts, be presented in writing to the Department Executive Committee at least sixty (60) days before the opening of the convention and the Department Adjutant shall transmit a copy to each Post at least thirty (30) days prior to such convention."

Did You Know, we might have had an American Legion Camp in Durham, Conn.?

Chairman and past Department Commander Arthur J. Kelley headed up a special Child Welfare Camp Committee to purchase and establish a child welfare camp in the State of Connecticut. \$200 was earmarked for promotional efforts. The proposed camp for sale at \$30,000 was the old YMCA Camp in Durham. Executive Committee Minutes March 5, 1950, pg 5

By a vote of 13 to 3, the committee was authorized "to continue its activity by soliciting the entire Legionnaire membership for funds and any money collected be placed in a special fund..., such monies to be returned to the individual donors if the program was not followed through to completion."

Did You know that in 1963 & 1964, **Adam T. Raczkowski** received a Distinguished Service Citation for his efforts and accomplishments during the year 1963 and 64?

1963: Southington Post 72 had a membership of 430 members, he went to the homes of members and veterans, securing 170 renewals and 51 new members.

1964: Southington Post 72 had a membership of 490 members, he secured 302 renewals and 50 new members. Today, he would have been a Gold Brigadier! Adam T. Raczkowski was inducted into the 2015 Connecticut American Legion Hall of Fame.

Have you ever heard of The American Legion Blue Crutch Tag Day?

Letter from R.A. Warren, Commander of Leo J. L'Homme Post 21 to Norman Levesque, 4th District Commander, dated January 21, 1956. The letter noted that the post had raised \$444.95. Originally reported and raised \$173.95 on Jan 6 & 7. Donations were raised through the American Legion "Blue Crutch Tag Day." "On the evening of Jan. 20th & all day on the 21st, we had our American Legion Ambulance on display in the Danielson Business area. Through the cooperation of the local March of Dimes...we obtained 500 Blue Crutches and March of Dimes lapel Buttons. This produced another \$271..." Letter found in Richard Snow's 1983-84, 4th District scrapbook. Richard Snow was inducted into the 2008 Connecticut American Legion Hall of Fame.

Assigned Topics

The assigned topic discourse must not consume less than three (3) minutes or more than five (5) minutes for delivery. The purpose of the assigned topic discourse is to test the speaker's knowledge of the subject, the extent of his or her research, and the ability to discuss the topic as related to the basic principles of government under the Constitution.

The assigned topic shall be drawn by the contest official in full view of the audience immediately before the last speaker begins delivery of his or her prepared oration and will be made known to the audience and each contestant approximately five (5) minutes prior to the time of delivery. The topic will be on some phase of the U.S. Constitution, selected from Articles and Sections as listed under assigned topics for the current year's contest in this brochure.

All contestants at each contest level are required to speak in the English language on the same assigned topic.

Amendment 8

Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted.

Amendment 26

Section 1. The right of citizens of the United States, who are eighteen years of age or older, to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of age.

Section 2. The Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

Article 1 Section 9 Paragraph 2

The privilege of the Writ of Habeas Corpus shall not be suspended, unless when in Cases of Rebellion or Invasion the public Safety may require it.


Article 1 Section 6 Clause 1

The Senators and Representatives shall receive a Compensation for their Services, to be ascertained by Law, and paid out of the Treasury of the United States. They shall in all Cases, except Treason, Felony and Breach of the Peace, be privileged from Arrest during their Attendance at the Session of their respective Houses, and in going to and returning from the same; and for any Speech or Debate in either House, they shall not be questioned in any other Place.






