Remember: The new Membership Task Force can help ease the burden, and is available to assist. Contact your District Commander to request assistance.


It is our goal collectively to get 100% in membership in the Department of Connecticut. We are in it together and together we can make it happen.

#### COMMANDER'S PROJECT VETERANS LANDING



Veterans Landing will be a state-of-the-art, affordable assisted living residence for older veterans and their spouses. Studio and one-bedroom apartments in this lovely home will be available on the VA Health Care Campus in Newington. In addition to 103 apartments, Veterans Landing will offer activity rooms (including a library and computer lab); convenience store; on-site medical care and physical therapy; excellent meals in a restaurant-style dining room; and transportation for shopping, medical appointments and field trips. This residence is modeled after CRT's award-winning assisted living in Hartford.

#### How can Connecticut's American Legion help?

- Raise awareness be an ambassador for this project
- Raise your voice help advocate for this through the VA system
- Raise dollars either as individuals or through your post.
- Here are a few examples of the 'Wish List.' CRT will publish a full list, and people can sign up as donors. The needs start small and go all the way up, up up!
  - \$9 buys a pair of yoga blocks for the gym
  - \$18 buys a single place setting for the dining room: Plate, cup, saucer, soup bowl, silverware and drinking glass.
  - o \$50 buys two 8-quart mixing bowls
  - \$110 will get one microwave but they need one for every apartment
  - \$250 for heart rate monitor
  - \$1,000 buys one all-season patio table with umbrella and they will need eight
  - \$3,000 secures one golf cart for on-campus travel eventually they'll require four of these
  - o \$3,850 gets one 60-foot flagpole but the design calls for at least three of these
  - o \$7,300 will buy a full set of barbells and weights, to keep residents fit
  - \$35 45,000 for each van
  - And an estimated \$165,000 for a safety pendant system!

#### Veterans' Quality of Life

- \$18 for each dining room place setting 150 required
- \$750 per year for art supplies
- o \$1,450 for 55" flat screen TV, sound system, DVD player and Wii in recreation area
- o \$1,655 for all-season patio table with umbrella and four chairs total of 8 sets required
- \$6,000 to furnish first floor living room couch, chairs, tables, lamps, gas fireplace
- \$35,000-45,000 for each van with lift, will need two for recreational outings, doctor visits off campus

#### Safety and Security

- o \$160 first aid kits
- \$500 for each bathroom emergency call box in public areas eight required
- \$1,500 for security door controls will need two sets
- \$3,000 for each golf cart for on-campus travel four will be required
- \$165,000 personal safety system resident pendants plus monitoring station
- \$200,000 for camera system

#### **Veterans Staying Fit and Healthy**

- o \$249 for one heart rate monitor
- \$650 pulley and weight system
- \$1,200 physical therapy platform
- \$1,500 staircase and mobility runway
- o \$3,500 for one treadmill, fitness gym will require at least two
- \$7,300 for a full set of barbells and weights

I encourage all Posts, Auxiliary Units, SAL Squadrons and Legion Riders Chapters to take a close look at this project, this is exactly what we as a Legion family can come together and support as this is a Veterans project within our own state that we can control what our money goes towards. As you see on the previous page, Commander Harry "Butch" Hansen has named Veterans Landing as his Commanders Project. Community Renewal Team was chosen by the US Department of Veterans Affairs to build and operate one of the very first affordable assisted living residences in the country for vets and their spouses on the VA Newington campus. This is a chance to get in on the ground floor of a really important initiative: People across the US will be looking at Veterans Landing to see how it's done!

We were very proud when the Commander asked us to serve as the official liaisons between the Veterans Landing team and our American Legion posts around Connecticut. We have both served on the Veterans Landing Advisory Council, and we can honestly say that this is a very exciting, and a very meaningful project!

The American Legion is the first Connecticut VSO to take on this challenge: Raising funds and awareness about Veterans Landing, and the issue of aging low- and middle-income veterans in Connecticut. Let's set a strong example for the entire state!

So now what? Butch is asking you and your posts to raise money for Veterans Landing in any way you wish. The sky's the limit! Dinners at nearby restaurants are always popular — we've had good luck at Chili's and Outback Steakhouse. There may be a family-owned eatery in your town that would cooperate. But you know what works in your area, from breakfasts to barbecues to ball games and other outings.

#### How can we help?

- Get in touch with one of us for ideas, planning or support. We'll provide a "boiler plate" for the press release you'll use to announce your fundraiser, and a sample invite letter to your elected officials.
- Community Renewal Team can provide all kinds of materials about Veterans Landing. There are flyers, brochures, and oversized posters that show the front and back of the building. There are also Veterans Landing pins and bracelets to give away at your event, and caps for the members who organize the event.
- Senior staff from CRT is also happy to come out and speak at a post meeting, public event or whenever veterans' advocates gather.

#### 2014–2015 Membership Goal Incentives

Our goal is to get 100% quota in each District (all 7 Districts 100%) though it seems lofty, it is doable with a little effort by everyone.

#### Incentive award program

- 1. Any district who reaches the 100% goal prior to the National deadline will receive a \$250.00 check to use any way they see fit plus the District Commander and Sr Vice will receive one overnight stay at the Department Convention.
- 2. Any Post reaching 100% goal by National deadline will receive a Certificate.
- 3. Any individual who signs up 15 new members will receive a \$50.00 check and a plaque for being a top recruiter.
  - Numbers will have to be verified by Department Headquarters in the following manner: The individual will have to send in the list of names that he/she signed up (preferably with ID #) and Department Headquarters will verify that those new members are in fact in the data base and new.
- 4. Any individual who signs up 25 or more new members will receive a \$100.00 check and be submitted to National for the Silver Brigade award.
- 5. Any individual who signs up 50 or more new members will receive a \$200.00 check and be submitted to National for the Gold Brigade award.

<u>NOTE:</u> No monies will be awarded until all verifications are complete. Individual will be presented their award at a post or district meeting and also be recognized at Department convention.

DEPARTMENT RECRUITER OF THE YEAR: Each Legion post will have the opportunity to submit the name of the "Top Recruiter" for that post who has signed up the highest number of new members for the current membership year by May 11 of each year. Department Adjutants will determine the top new-member recruiter for their respective department and certify their "Department Recruiter" to National Headquarters on or before May 31 of each year. The "Department Recruiter" properly certified from each department will be awarded a plaque with his/her accomplishment inscribed thereon.

#### 100<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE AMERICAN LEGION 2019



June 10, 1919: A Beginning

#### Note:

This is for the most part, re-written as Alfred N. Phillips wrote it. But, I have corrected fragment sentences.

"Minutes of The First Meeting of the Temporary State Executive Committee on The American Legion, Connecticut Branch, Held at the City Club in Hartford, CT Tuesday, June 10, 1919.

The American Legion began to take definite form today when twelve of the fourteen men who had attended the St. Louis caucus met at the City Club for an all day session. The meeting was called to order at 11:30 am with the temporary chairman, James B. Moody, Jr. presiding. They signed their names to the certificate of incorporation to be filed with the secretary of the state on Thursday, June 12, 1919. The Temporary Committee adopted the charter and by-laws for the state organization of the Legion in Conn. and elected temporary officers, who will hold office until the State Convention here in October.

The temporary officers elected were: James B. Moody, Jr., of Hartford, chairman; Alfred N. Phillips, Jr. of Stamford, secretary; William J. Malone of Bristol, Vice Chairman; Francis W. Carroll of Waterbury, second vice chairman; Frank S. Butterworth of New Haven, treasurer. The full personnel of the executive committee were voted to consist of those delegates who had gone to the St. Louis convention, namely: James B. Moody, Jr., Alfred N. Phillips, Jr., Bernard H. Mattheis of Seymour, William J. Malone of Bristol, Walter D. Makepeace, Francis W. Carroll and James S. Hurley of Waterbury, Philo C. Calhoun of Bridgeport, Webster D. Copp of Norwich, Morton C. Tilney of Essex, Paul L. Sampsell of New London, Rev. Harry C. Meserve of Stamford, Hiram Bingham and Frank S. Butterworth of New Haven and Robert Vance of New Britain.

"After today, you are going to see The American Legion grow in this state like a mushroom," declared Mr. Moody. "We already have received petitions for charters from local organizations representing a total membership of nearly 3,000 men. We should have more than 10,000 members in Connecticut posts before the first state convention."

It was decided that the dues for membership in the Legion should be an enrollment fee of \$1. and thereafter annual dues at the minimum rate of two dollars, payable and collectable on or after November 11 of each year. It was also decided that from the enrollment fees and dues, the state executive committee should have the right to call upon each post. Or organization, for an amount not to exceed 40 percent of the minimum amount collected.

#### 100<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE AMERICAN LEGION 2019

It was voted that not more than one charter be granted to any city in the state of less than 100,000 population and that not more than two charters be granted to posts of the Legion in cities of more than 100,000 population.

The executive committee announced that they were ready to act upon petitions from local organizations desiring to be among the first posts of the Legion in the state.

The first charter of The American Legion for Connecticut was granted to Waterbury after a petition signed by about 150 names had been presented by W.D. Makepeace. This new post will be known as Waterbury Post No. 1 of The American Legion. William J. Malone spoke for Bristol, saying that the city had an appropriation of \$7,000 with which to organize a non-military association for all exservicemen and had withheld all organization because the servicemen in Bristol were anxious to organize a post of The American Legion and had really started their plans before Waterbury citizens had. The charter of post No. 2, to be located at Bristol, was granted on Mr. Malone's recommendation. A.N. Phillips, Jr., made the next plea for a charter of the Legion in Connecticut, telling what Stamford had done since the war for ex-servicemen. The Charter was granted to Stamford, the title to be Stamford Post No. 3. Applications were also favorably received for Watertown and New Britain for the granting of charters and will be acted upon at the next meeting. Chairman Moody brought up the matter of Hartford posts and said that the city will probably support two posts and that the Hartford citizens assume that they will be named for Major George J. Rau and Captain Arthur Locke. The chairman and secretary were authorized to employ any clerical help necessary to carry out their work for the Legion and it was voted that copies of the state constitution and by-laws be sent to the various posts in the state as suggestions for adoption but not to be considered obligatory. The chairman reported that copies of The American Legion Weekly would soon be ready and that the Special Fourth of July number could be secured by any member of the Legion sending their order to the secretary.

There being no further business, it was voted to adjourn, it being about 5:30 P.M.

RESOLVED, By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis, Indiana, on May 4-5, 1988, That The American Legion shall not be a member of, or affiliated with, any organization, committee, association, council or group whereby The American Legion might be committed to a policy contrary to that adopted by The American Legion; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That the National Adjutant is instructed to circulate this resolution to all Departments and National Officers of The American Legion on a yearly basis.



## "2014 CONNECTICUT VETERANS PARADE" SENDS OUT THE CALL FOR MARCHERS & SPONSORS FROM ALL OVER STATE

New England's Largest Veterans Parade is Sunday, November 2

HARTFORD, CONN., September 5, 2014 – Calling all U.S. veterans and active military personnel from across Connecticut. The "2014 Connecticut Veterans Parade" is seeking participants for this year's colorful statewide parade! The 15<sup>th</sup> annual procession will step off on Sunday, November 2 at 12:30 p.m. near the Connecticut State Capitol Building in Hartford and will march through the Downtown area. The Parade will take place a week before the actual federal and state observances of Veterans Day.

Approximately 3,000 people march or ride every year in the Connecticut Veterans Parade, making it the largest veterans' parade in New England and one of the biggest salutes to veterans in the entire U.S. The parade honors the dedication and sacrifices of servicemen and women from all U.S. conflicts, and offers state residents the opportunity to express their thanks. Special features will include a tolling of church bells and 1:30 p.m. Moment of Silence when the parade pauses in observance of service members who died while serving their country. One hour before the start of the parade, there will be an 11:30 a.m. wreath-laying ceremony at the Soldiers & Sailors Memorial Arch in Bushnell Park.

"This parade is a **visually powerful and poignant tribute** to the dedicated servicemen and women of all conflicts who stepped forward so we that can continue to enjoy our freedom," explains Paul F. Pendergast, President of the Connecticut Veterans Parade and a U.S. Air Force veteran himself. "We encourage people from all corners of Connecticut and beyond to make the time to come line the streets of Downtown Hartford and say 'Thank You' for their sacrifices."

The event is organized by a nonprofit collaboration of veterans' groups, corporations, local municipalities, businesses and civic organizations. The **Connecticut National Guard** assists with the management of parade logistics, and the City of Hartford hosts the event. Many of the members of the Parade Planning Committee have been involved in the parade since its inception more than a decade ago.


