My Fellow Legionnaires,

I want to start this month's message by wishing you and your families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Please take the time to enjoy the holidays and spend time with your families as they always seem to go by too quickly.

I wasn't really sure what I was going to write about this month until some issues came our way and I thought this would be a good opportunity address them and let you know this could easily happen to your post. Normally the Department would not get involved with post issues unless they involve illegal acts that would require the Department to take action against the post and protect The American Legion name.

Recently there have been some issues involving posts with bars and on both occasions it involved an anonymous phone call to the Liquor Commission by an individual who was extremely upset with the post for reasons that cannot be discussed. This is a good time to remind posts with bars that the bar does not control how the post operates; in fact it is the other way around, the post has all of the power and can at any time make the decision to close the bar if they so desire. Those posts that have a permittee in name only need to seriously reconsider how you do business as that individual is ultimately responsible for what happens within that bar and could cause the post to lose everything because of your neglect or outright refusal not be involved with the day to day operations of the business. If your post officers and members are not aware of how your bar is being run, I highly suggest you educate yourselves, because all it takes is one individual who was mistreated or feels that something illegal is going on to make that phone call and bring everything crashing down.

What I am trying to tell you is that if your post is in this situation where the bar runs the post and not the other way around you need to fix this problem before you become the next casualty of an anonymous phone call that could put your post in danger of losing their charter or even worse; your post home. Don't let it get to the point where the Department has to come in and conduct an investigation and possibly make the decision to suspend your charter and close your doors until we can put all the pieces back together. Let this serve as fair warning...

Mid-Winter Conference

It is time to register for our 41st Mid-Winter Conference. Treat your officers and 'up and coming members' to the Mid-Winter Conference at the Trumbull Marriott Merritt Parkway, 180 Hawley Lane, Trumbull, CT on January 23-25, 2015. See the enclosed registration flyer for details. The Saturday evening banquet will include the ninth class of inductees to the Department of Connecticut Legionnaire Hall of Fame (see list in this Bulletin!). The Hall of Fame Plaque with plates for all members will be on display. As always, we will have the Liquor Control Commission back on Friday evening. Come and ask questions regarding the laws applicable to your post Bar and especially Public Act No. 14-114 which was effective October 1st, regarding who no longer must sign your guest book. Featured guests include: National Commander Candidate Charles Schmidt (OR) and National Vice-Commander Doug Haggan, a Past Commander of the Department of France! We also anticipate having a surprise speaker first thing in the morning to set the tone and get everyone excited about the day. I have also extended an invitation to CT DVA Acting Commissioner Joseph Perkins to talk briefly about his ideas for our organization's interaction with and support of CT DVA. In the Afternoon General Session, National Assistant Membership Director Sean Sparks will have some time to talk membership (probably recruiting & retention). Saturday afternoon will have the usual breakout for Fund reps (1:00-2:00) and Service Officers (2:00-3:00). We will also have a demonstration of how to go online and add your Post to the Centennial Celebration website by establishing a Post History page (site is hosted by National). For the seventh year, we will have the door prize drawings for cash that will take place at the end of the general session (approximately 3:30 Saturday). All Connecticut Legionnaires should have received six tickets by mail. You do not need to be present to win, HOWEVER, if you are present and you win any level prize (1st through 7th), you will receive a \$250 attendance bonus. Additional tickets are available from HQ and will be available at the Conference. After the close of the general session (4:00) there will be a 40 & 8 Grand Cheminot that all Voyagers will be welcome to attend.

LegionCare is a one-of-a-kind benefit offered exclusively to Legionnaires and provides: \$5,000 in Accidental Death Coverage for covered accidents that occur if you are traveling on official Legion business; \$1,000 for all other covered accidents; 24/7 protection that covers Legionnaires at home, at work and while travelling away from home. IMPORTANT: Every few years each Legionnaire must confirm their \$5,000 in protection in order to be covered. Legionnaires may activate their coverage through the LegionCare application or by going online at www.theLIT.com. Our goal is to ensure that every Legionnaire activates this protection. Current activation will provide protection until August 31, 2016.



COMMANDER'S PROJECT VETERANS LANDING



Veterans Landing will be a state-of-the-art, affordable assisted living residence for older veterans and their spouses. Studio and one-bedroom apartments in this lovely home will be available on the VA Health Care Campus in Newington. In addition to 103 apartments, Veterans Landing will offer activity rooms (including a library and computer lab); convenience store; on-site medical care and physical therapy; excellent meals in a restaurant-style dining room; and transportation for shopping, medical appointments and field trips. This residence is modeled after CRT's award-winning assisted living in Hartford.

How can Connecticut's American Legion help?

- Raise awareness be an ambassador for this project
- Raise your voice help advocate for this through the VA system
- Raise dollars either as individuals or through your post.
- Here are a few examples of the 'Wish List.' CRT will publish a full list, and people can sign up as
 donors. The needs start small and go all the way up, up up!
 - \$9 buys a pair of yoga blocks for the gym
 - \$18 buys a single place setting for the dining room: Plate, cup, saucer, soup bowl, silverware and drinking glass.
 - \$50 buys two 8-quart mixing bowls
 - o \$110 will get one microwave but they need one for every apartment
 - \$250 for heart rate monitor
 - \$1,000 buys one all-season patio table with umbrella and they will need eight
 - \$3,000 secures one golf cart for on-campus travel eventually they'll require four of these
 - \$3,850 gets one 60-foot flagpole but the design calls for at least three of these
 - 57,300 will buy a full set of barbells and weights, to keep residents fit
 - \$35 45,000 for each van
 - And an estimated \$165,000 for a safety pendant system!

Veterans' Quality of Life

- \$18 for each dining room place setting 150 required
- o \$750 per year for art supplies
- o \$1,450 for 55" flat screen TV, sound system, DVD player and Wii in recreation area
- o \$1,655 for all-season patio table with umbrella and four chairs total of 8 sets required
- o \$6,000 to furnish first floor living room couch, chairs, tables, lamps, gas fireplace
- \$35,000-45,000 for each van with lift, will need two for recreational outings, doctor visits off campus

Safety and Security

- o \$160 first aid kits
- o \$500 for each bathroom emergency call box in public areas eight required
- \$1,500 for security door controls will need two sets
- \$3,000 for each golf cart for on-campus travel four will be required
- o \$165,000 personal safety system resident pendants plus monitoring station
- o \$200,000 for camera system

Veterans Staying Fit and Healthy

- o \$249 for one heart rate monitor
- o \$650 pulley and weight system
- \$1,200 physical therapy platform
- o \$1,500 staircase and mobility runway
- \$3,500 for one treadmill, fitness gym will require at least two
- o \$7,300 for a full set of barbells and weights

I encourage all Posts, Auxiliary Units, SAL Squadrons and Legion Riders Chapters to take a close look at this project, this is exactly what we as a Legion family can come together and support as this is a Veterans project within our own state that we can control what our money goes towards. What an opportunity this is to show everyone in the state that The American Legion Family is truly behind our Veterans and what we can accomplish as a group when we all come together for one common goal. This is our chance to stand up and shout out to everyone that The American Legion is out their working hard to give our Veterans every opportunity humanly possible to better themselves and their families.

Department Adjutants will determine the top new-member recruiter for their respective department and certify their "Department Recruiter" to National Headquarters on or before May 31 of each year. 
