Let yourself be known for your "signature" project and membership will follow. 2014 Connecticut American Legion Hall of Fame Inductees

<u>Richard W. Anderson</u> is a member of the Cromwell American Legion, Post 105. He served in the US Coast Guard from 1960-64. He is a past post, 7th District, and Department Commander. He just completed 27 years as Connecticut's National Executive Committeeman. He is now the National Americanism Chairman for the Legion.

<u>Richard Grant</u>, deceased. He was a veteran of WWII and a Purple Heart recipient. He was recognized for all his contributions he made to the Hebron American Legion, Post 95 and the 4th District. And although he died in Florida, he was very active in Connecticut for over 30 years. He was a graduate of UCONN, served in the State Legislature and he was a First Selectman in Hebron. His granddaughter was a past National Historian for the American Legion Auxiliary Juniors in 1985.

<u>Bill Lucas</u>, deceased, was a World War II Veteran. He belonged to New Haven Post 162 for almost 60 years. He was a past post, 2nd District and Department Commander. He served as Post Finance Officer for over 35 years and was on the Department Boys' State Commission for 30 years. His daughter: Janet Jefford will become the National President of the American Legion Auxiliary in August 2014.

<u>Bill Gulya</u>, deceased, was a World War II Veteran. He belonged to the Danbury American Legion, Post 60 for 64 years. He followed in his dad's footsteps, as a long time adjutant. Bill taught elementary and middle school kids in Norwalk for over 25 years. He was a past post and 3rd District Commander. The Legion and the Auxiliary became a family thing to do. Mary Gulya was a Department President in the 80's and Helen Goewey is the current Department President.

<u>David Greenleaf</u> served in the Army Reserves in the 70's. Currently, he is a teacher and coach at Bristol H.S. He was an official scorer for the Bristol Red Sox and the Bristol American Legion, Post 2 Baseball Team. He was honored for his involvement with The American Legion and Boys State; First as a delegate in 1965, then as a counsellor and, now, the Chairman/Director of the Connecticut Boys State program.

<u>Walt Tallman</u> served in the Army National Guard during the Korean War, but he served in Germany. He was recognized for all he has done for the veterans of Colchester. He has signed up hundreds of new members over the years and has been recognized as the 2010 Man of the Year by the Colchester Lion's and Rotary Clubs. He is a co-founder of a South Eastern Connecticut "Antique Veterans" Honor Guard.





Talk with your schools to see if they would like to invite OMK for an orientation for the educators. You would give Lisa Marcinkowski (OMK program director) contact information so they could get in touch with her.



SUBJECT: MySAL

During the fall National Executive Committee meeting held in Indianapolis, Indiana on October 11-12, 2013, a special presentation was made on the new "MySAL" program and the initial rollout of this system to all sons squadrons across the country. This presentation from Mr Joe Gallagher, Deputy Director of the National Headquarters IT Division was introduced on that Saturday and included a special power point presentation describing what the program is and features that are now available for all squadrons.

For those of you that did not attend and those just getting the word on this new program, MySAL.org is a secure internet site linked to the membership data base for the Sons. The portal site MySAL.org provides officers with access to the membership data and member-management tools.

The squadron adjutant or his designated representative can view and edit squadron membership for his squadron. This includes making changes to names, addresses, and date of birth information. He can generate membership listings and listings of current paid members as well as viewing current status, i.e. paid and transmittal information. The squadron adjutant can generate reports available in CSV file format which will allow users to work with the data in microsoft excel and access to include the capability of generating labels for use in local mailings. This, if used properly can be a great membership tool and can greatly assist in membership renewals.

Now - how can you get started? Just go to the internet page www.legion.org/sons and click on mysal link. Complete the authorization form listed, obtain the proper authorization signatures for your squadron and mail it to the address provided on the form.

To date, over 106 squadron applications have been received and more are arriving each day. Keep in mind only one person can be authorized per squadron. Also, the squadron adjutant or his designated person must be a sons members with current membership dues paid. What does this cost – it's free of charge to all members. This can be one of the greatest membership tools ever, if used.

We ask you to pass this along to all detachment and squadron leadership.

- 1. Any District which reaches the 100% goal prior to the National deadline will receive a \$500.00 check to use any way they see fit. (Department Adjutant will determine this).
- 2. Any <u>individual</u> who signs up 15 new members will receive a \$50.00 check and a plaque for being a top recruiter.
 - a. Numbers will have to be verified by Department Headquarters in the following manner: The individual will have to <u>send in the list of names</u> that he/she signed up and department headquarters will verify that those members are in fact new members in the post.
- 3. Any <u>individual</u> who signs up 25 or more new members will receive a \$100.00 check and be submitted to National for the Silver Brigade award. (List of NEW members must be submitted to Department Adjutant for certification).
- 4. Any <u>individual</u> who signs up 50 or more new members will receive a \$200.00 check and be submitted to National for the Gold Brigade award. (List of NEW members must be submitted to Department Adjutant for certification).
- 5. Any <u>individual</u> who is personally responsible for transferring 25 or more individuals from post 200 into their respective post will receive a check for \$50.00.
 - a. Transfers will have to be verified by department headquarters in the following manner: The individual will have to <u>send in the list of names</u> that they submitted transfer paperwork for and the department will verify with the post membership chairman who submitted the paperwork for approval.

NOTE: No monies will be awarded until all verifications are complete. Individual will be presented their award at a Post or District meeting and also be recognized at Department convention.

DEPARTMENT RECRUITER OF THE YEAR: Each Legion post will have the opportunity to submit the name of the "*Top Recruiter*" for that post who has signed up the highest number of new members for the **current** membership year by **May 9** of each year. Department Adjutants will determine the top new-member recruiter for their respective Department and certify their "*Department Recruiter*" to National Headquarters on or before **May 31** of each year. The "*Department Recruiter*" properly certified from each department will be awarded a plaque with his/her accomplishment inscribed thereon.
