
My Fellow Legionnaires,



Sample Poppy Proclamation

WHEREAS, America is the land of freedom, preserved and protected willingly and freely by citizen soldiers;

WHEREAS, millions who have answered the call to arms have died on the field of battle;

WHEREAS, a nation at peace must be reminded of the price of war and the debt owed to those who have died in war;

WHEREAS, The red poppy has been designated as a symbol of sacrifice of lives in all wars; and

WHEREAS, The American Legion Auxiliary has pledged to remind America annually of this debt through the distribution of the memorial flower:

THEREFORE, I (full name) (title), of the (city, town, country, state) do hereby proclaim this (date)th day of (month), (year), as POPPY DAY and ask that all citizens pay tribute to those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the name of freedom by wearing the Memorial Poppy on this day.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the official seal of (city, town, county, state) this (date)th day of (month), (year).

2015 Connecticut American Legion Hall of Fame Inductees

Eugene Peter Armstrong, WWI Army Veteran, joined Corporal Coyle Post 1, Waterbury and served as Post, Department, National Vice-Commander, NEC, 40/8 Grand Chef de Gare and served as the Department Treasurer/SS&M Fund Director: 1930-53. His motto was "Still Serving: It's Who We Are."

<u>THOMAS W. BYERS</u>, A Navy Veteran of World War I, a charter and honorary life member of Clifford R. French Post 22, Thomaston. He was the Post and 6th District Commander. Post Service Officer and Soldiers, Sailors and Marine Fund Representative in Thomaston for 35 years. He was on the Department Rehabilitation Commission for 23 years and Chairman for 17 years. Jim Bement, a 2010 Hall of Fame inductee, noted "He smoked Big Black Smelly Cigars."

Adam Thomas Raczkowski was a WWI Army Veteran and a member of the Lost Battalion. He was a Post Commander of Kiltonic Post 72, Southington. Adam was Foreign Relations Chairman, Post Adjutant, Publicity Chairman, District Delegate, Boys' State Chairman and Counsellor. During the 60's and 70's he ran for just about every Department office. At the time of his death, he had more than 25,000 hours of voluntary service at the Veteran's Hospitals.

Joseph Myjak was a WWII Army veteran who took part in the D-Day invasion and the Battle of the Bulge. He was a life time member of Frank J. Stempick Post 162, New Haven. He was an all-time high Post Commander, Military Ball Chairman, Adjutant, Finance Officer, Senior and Junior Vice-Commander. He was the Post, District and Department Sgt-At-Arms for Bill Lucas. He was the person, who talked to the students in the Hamden and doctors at the Yale Medical School. He was an Advocate for veterans and their stories. Joseph Myjak died January 24, 2015.

ANGELO DELLACAMERA, Angi was signed by the Yankees to a minor league contract. During Spring training, he played with Phil Rizzuto and Joe DiMaggio. He was a WWII and Korean War Era Vet. He took part in the Allied invasion of Sicily as a Tank Commander with Patton's 43rd Division, 3rd Armored Battalion. He first joined his dad's Post 47. But transferred to the West Haven Legion, Post 71, where he became their baseball coach, twice Post Commander, District Historian, Executive committeeman and honorary life member. He is well known as one of the best Sgt-at-Arms in the State. He has been a Sgt-at-Arms at least once every decade since 1970, this includes Post, District and Department. In 2010, Angi was the Sgt-at-Arms of the year.

Miguel Escalera enlisted in the Army during WWII and was awarded two Presidential Unit Citations, the Silver Star for gallantry and two Combat Bronze Stars for heroism. "Still Serving America" has definitely been Miguel's motto. He has served as the Agent for Veterans' Affairs for the Town of Clinton and Fund Representative for the Soldiers Sailors and Marines' Fund continuously for more than 50 years. Miguel is a past post commander, 7th District Commander, Department Executive Committeeman and a long time member of the Dept. Internal Affairs Commission. The Legion has been a huge part of Miguel Escalera's life and through that service and commitment, he was inducted into the 2013 Connecticut Veteran's Hall of Fame.

And in 1985-86, once again, he followed Fred Treat up the chairs: Junior and Senior Vice in the District. In 1986-88, he was the 5th District Commander. In 1991-92, he served as the Department Eastern Area Vice-Commander with Gus Williams and Rae Fredrickson. He was an excellent father, his daughter: Karen is a Past Department President.

Steve Fahy joined the Marines in May, 1966 and Just 6 months later, he was in Vietnam. Sometime after being shot, he made a Med Cruise and had Guard Duty in Argenta, Newfoundland. He joined the American Legion, Niantic Post 128 in 1976, but transferred to Seicheprey Post 2, soon afterward. He became Post Commander, District Commander and Sgt-at-Arms for the Auxiliary's Baltimore National Convention Parade. He was known for "Hippity-Hop-Stop". He was a quota District Commander. And, in 1991, with the help of Area Vice-Commander Gus Williams, he, as Captain, recruited a Department Color Guard that still is active today. Steve has been a good sport over the years. He has been Santa Claus, a white Bunny with a lime green cape and a leprechaun. And, in 1991 and 92, he took part in the foolish follies. He has been an active member for the last 38 years out of 39 years as a post, District and Department Officer.

Excerpt from address by Congressman ANTONI N.SADLAK, (R, At-Large, Conn.) at the 36th Annual Convention of the Connecticut Department of The American Legion at Bridgeport, Connecticut, July 17, 1954:

"The cold war against Communism can be as effective as military battles of the past. But a successful cold war requires planning and nerve, loyalty and intense unity of effort.

"Our most effective weapon is our ability to see clearly the real and present danger in communist aggression, and the imperative need for a united American citizenry aligned solidly behind President Eisenhower against the ruthless, godless Soviet system, and against all who would compromise with it.

"In the constant war that is being waged against us by Communism, all of us have a duty to defend our national security, soldiers in civilian clothes as well as those in uniform, to defeat the invisible enemy who is trying to confuse, divide and weaken us. This is one of the major battlegrounds today and perhaps for many years to come. Only by a unified effort can we survive."







A \$500.00 maximum grant will be awarded for the year 2014-2015 by the PAST PRESIDENTS' PARLEY to assist a child, grandchild or great grandchild of an ex-service WOMAN, who is a member for at least 3 years in The American Legion/American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Connecticut, or who was a member for three (3) years prior to their death, to secure an education beyond the high school level.

In the event there are not enough applicants from ex-service woman's children, grandchildren or great grandchildren, the scholarship grant will be awarded to the child, grandchild or great grandchild of a member of The American Legion/American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Connecticut, who has been a member for three (3) years or was a member for the three (3) years prior to their death, or a child, grandchild or great grandchild that is a member of the American Legion Auxiliary/Sons of The American Legion, Department of Connecticut for at least three (3) years.

At least one Grant will be for a Nursing Student.

RULES:

- 1. Applicant must not be over 23 years of age and in an undergraduate program.
- 2. Applicant must show need of financial assistance. (Please be sure all financial questions on application are properly filled out showing any exceptional needs.)



Veterans Landing will be a state-of-the-art, affordable assisted living residence for older veterans and their spouses. Studio and one-bedroom apartments in this lovely home will be available on the VA Health Care Campus in Newington. In addition to 103 apartments, Veterans Landing will offer activity rooms (including a library and computer lab); convenience store; on-site medical care and physical therapy; excellent meals in a restaurant-style dining room; and transportation for shopping, medical appointments and field trips. This residence is modeled after CRT's award-winning assisted living in Hartford.

How can Connecticut's American Legion help?

- Raise awareness be an ambassador for this project
- Raise your voice help advocate for this through the VA system
- Raise dollars either as individuals or through your post.
- Here are a few examples of the 'Wish List.' CRT will publish a full list, and people can sign up as donors. The needs start small and go all the way up, up up!
 - o \$9 buys a pair of yoga blocks for the gym
 - \$18 buys a single place setting for the dining room: Plate, cup, saucer, soup bowl, silverware and drinking glass.
 - \$50 buys two 8-quart mixing bowls
 - o \$110 will get one microwave but they need one for every apartment
 - \$250 for heart rate monitor
 - o \$1,000 buys one all-season patio table with umbrella and they will need eight
 - \$3,000 secures one golf cart for on-campus travel eventually they'll require four of these
 - o \$3,850 gets one 60-foot flagpole but the design calls for at least three of these
 - o \$7,300 will buy a full set of barbells and weights, to keep residents fit
 - o \$35 45,000 for <u>each</u> van
 - And an estimated \$165,000 for a safety pendant system!

Veterans' Quality of Life

- o \$18 for each dining room place setting 150 required
- o \$750 per year for art supplies
- o \$1,450 for 55" flat screen TV, sound system, DVD player and Wii in recreation area
- o \$1,655 for all-season patio table with umbrella and four chairs total of 8 sets required
- o \$6,000 to furnish first floor living room couch, chairs, tables, lamps, gas fireplace
- \$35,000-45,000 for each van with lift, will need two for recreational outings, doctor visits off campus

Safety and Security

- o \$160 first aid kits
- \$500 for each bathroom emergency call box in public areas eight required
- \$1,500 for security door controls will need two sets
- \$3,000 for each golf cart for on-campus travel four will be required
- o \$165,000 personal safety system resident pendants plus monitoring station
- o \$200,000 for camera system

Veterans Staying Fit and Healthy

- \$249 for one heart rate monitor
- \$650 pulley and weight system
- o \$1,200 physical therapy platform
- \$1,500 staircase and mobility runway
- o \$3,500 for one treadmill, fitness gym will require at least two
- \$7,300 for a full set of barbells and weights
