Our History St. Louis Caucus

The delegates from Connecticut met in the Pennsylvania Hotel in New York City on the afternoon of May 6, 1919, later taking a special delegates' train at the Pennsylvania Station for St. Louis, delegates from other adjacent states being on the train. It was 5:30 p.m. when the special train left and there were seven cars full of men, all interested in one great idea, which they were on their way to help put into concrete shape. In St. Louis the delegates were quartered in the Jefferson and Statler Hotels. The Jefferson Theatre was the meeting place of the convention.

Those making up the party from Connecticut were: James B. Moody, Jr., at that time state chairman; Alfred N. Phillips, Jr., then state secretary and later state chairman ; William J. Malone, later state secretary; F. W. Carroll and Paul L. Sampsell, vice chairmen; Frank S. Butterworth, state treasurer; Bernard H. Matthies, Philo C. Calhoun, W. D. Copp, James S. Hurley, H. C. Meserve, Morton C. Tiley and Robert Vance.

HISTORY IS IMPORTANT

The South Windsor American Legion Post 133 has a long and treasured history.

Abe E. Miller was born on February 1, 1890 in Moscow, Russia. He grew up in Tolland, CT and worked on his Uncle Louie Miller's farm in South Windsor CT.

He received his Draft Card on 5 May, 1917. His card number was 966. He was a member of The CT National Guard and served as a Private with F Company, 102nd Infantry Regiment in France during WW I. He died July 21, 1918 while fighting in France. He is buried in Fere-en-Tarenois, France in the Oise-Aisne American Cemetery Plot A, row 4, grave 24.

The South Windsor Post 133 was named for this World War I Soldier.

Post 133 received its temporary Charter on September 27, 1933, and the permanent Charter on October 3, 1934.

2017 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

RICHARD JOSEPH OLSON Honorary Life member of the Frank C. Godfrey Post 12, Norwalk.

RICHARD JOSEPH OLSON served in the US Army from 1971 to 1974 as a construction drafting course instructor. He was honorably discharged as a spec 5/E-5, noncommissioned officer. Rich joined the Legion by invitation of Mitch Meccico. He completed The American Legion Extension Course, The Virginia & Conn. Legion Colleges. Rich has been adjutant: 2002 to 2005, 2007-08, 2012-13. All the rest of the time, 10 years, he has been the Post 12 Commander. He is a past 3rd District Commander.

He has served on the Department Homeland Security Committee and Americanism Commission. He was co-director for the American Legion Family College for 4 years, Director & member of personnel, chair for the Dept. Awards Committee... and is a counselor & commission member for Boys' State. He is a member of the Centennial Committee and heads up District and Post activities.

RAYMOND K. WILLIAMS Honorary Life member, 65 years helping other Veterans and our youth.

RAYMOND K. WILLIAMS served during World War II with the United States Air Force. Ray married Patricia and they have 3 sons. Raymond K. Williams first joined Moosup Post 91 at the conclusion of the war, April, 1948. He was an active Legionnaire at Post 91 and was on the original & first 5 VJ Day Parade Committees that was started in 1961. In 1970, he joined the Leo J. L'Homme – William F. Burdick, Jr Post 21, Danielson. And worked up the chairs until he was commander and for the last 42 years Ray has been the backbone of membership. In 1988, Danielson Post 21 team was state baseball champion. In the 4th District, he was the District Commander in 1991-92 & 2004-05. Even today at 90, he is still a Post 21 volunteer.

D. JOSEPH JACKSON, "Great in 88"

D. Joseph Jackson was drafted into the US Army on February 3, 1966 and served a 3 year hitch.

Joe's proudest thought about his service in Vietnam was that all the men who served and trained with him came home, walking! He became a member of The American Legion, New Hartford Post 28 in November, 1978 and was elected Post Commander, the night he joined... Then 6th District Commander, 1983-84. In 1984, he was the District Commander of the year. Department Offices: Historian 1986-87, Senior Vice Commander in 1987-88 and Commander in '89. He is well known for his Great In 88 Slogan...which became number 1 in '89. While C & Y Director, 1989-90, Hurricane Hugo slammed into South Carolina. Joe came to their aid. Then Joe took on the Oratorical Contest and ran the Regional Contest in Norfolk, Va. After that, he was the National Security Chairman and on Internal Affairs. From there he joined Finance and VA & R Commissions. Currently, he is on the Centennial Committee, Souvenir Chairman. Joe is married to Joe Anne and they have one daughter: Cari.

In 2007, he was elected Alternate National Executive Committeeman and then became NEC in 2013.

ARTHUR W. MELYCHER 4 time Silver Brigade Legionnaire

Art Melycher joined Winsted Post 43 in 1986 by invitation of the town Clerk: Bill Riska. Once Art retired from the US Navy as a Chief Petty Officer, he became active with the Post: Sgt-At-Arms, S,S & M Fund Rep, Vice Commander and commander starting in 1993. He has been GM for 3 post 43 baseball teams. 6th District Commander 3 years in the 1990's as District Commander achieved 100% plus membership & coordinated the 6th District Kids Walk. Had 2 World War 1 veterans receive the highest French Medal award presented by the French Ambassador. Closed down the Town Hall and main street for Ernie Pratt to receive this medal. All these years Art has been active at Legion Baseball, State Police Youth week, Boys State, Girls State, membership, fund raisers committees and helping the youth and veterans in Winsted. Art has a wife Monica, a son, Sean and a daughter, Laura.

2017 Hall of Fame Inductees

EVERETT G. SHEPARD, III 2006 to 2016 Department Adjutant & Honorary Life Member

EVERETT G. SHEPARD, III, Shep is an Army Veteran, who served from 1967-70 as a Military Intelligence non-Commissioned Officer. Everett is a 1974 graduate of Nichols College. In December 1976, he joined Benson-Flugel Post 111. Henry Mayer was his mentor. In 1977, he was the Post 111 Chaplain, Department Americanism Commission member and a Boys State Counsellor. He was the Post Commander: 78-81 & 85-86. By 1983 he became the 4th District Commander. Since then he has been the District judge advocate. In 1985, he received the Richard Anderson Americanism Award and in 1991, the Herbert L. Emanuelson Award. He was the 1996 Eastern Area Vice Cmdr. Then Dept. Historian, Senior Vice and Dept Commander in 1999-2000. From 1989 to 2006, he was on the National Magazine Commission. He married Pat and they have a son: Matthew and a granddaughter: Kira.

VICTOR W. YANOSY Enthusiasm & Team-Work gets more things done

Victor W Yanosy was born in July, 1945, his parents named him after His uncle, Victor Sippin. Vic first served in the Navy as an Aerographer's Mate from 1967 to 71... and then switched to the Army Reserves. He joined Sippin Winspur Post 176 in 1983. The following year, he was the post adjutant. From 1985 to 1998 & 2000 to present, he has been the post commander. He had been on the Memorial Day Committee 2001-2008, candy fund raiser, Eagle Scout and visiting schools committee. He has been the 3rd District baseball rep., senior vice commander and zone 5 assistant chairman for 17U. He even helped start a Bowling Team: Monroe Militia. He is the commander of a hardworking, enthusiastic and dedicated Legionnaires, who believe in patriotism and keeping America strong.

EMORY GUY MILLER died July 20, 1997. What's the word? Pride! Who's the Best? We are!

Emory Guy Miller served in the US Army Air Corp during WWII. Guy first married Barbara Bercier. They had 3 sons: Thomas, Ronald and Donald. Guy was a coach of many of Wallingford youth baseball teams and the Post 187 Legion team. As a Cub Scout Master, he received the Silver Beaver Award. He was 2nd District Commander, then Dept. Senior Vice and State Commander in 1990-91. He was the Editor of the Conn. Legionnaire, Dept. Oratorical Chairman, co-chair to the Mid-Winter Conference, and he dressed up as a lady for an auxiliary fund raiser. He was an all-time high State Commander. FANTASTIC!!!

JOYCE M. HARRIS National Star Award for the Sea Cadet Program which trained inner city youth

JOYCE M. HARRIS is a US Navy Vietnam Veteran. She mustered out as a Hospital Corpsman, second class petty officer. Joyce joined The American Legion, Niantic Post 128 in September, 1982. She participated in Flag Day, Memorial & Veterans Day, the oratorical contest, scholarships and Boys State. She assisted with breakfasts and dinners at the Post. She represented the Post as a member of the East Lyme Veterans Council and belongs to American Legion Auxiliary Unit 128. At the Post, Joyce started the Veterans Day Dinner, the Past Commanders and Presidents Dinner & the 4 chaplains program. Over the years, she became active in the Post & District. In 1997-98, she was Post Commander & District Sr. Vice. And in 2000-2001, she was the 5th District Commander. The following year, she was the 5th district chairman for the Kids Walk. In 2002, Joyce Harris and her husband started the Gales Ferry – Ledyard Post 2005. Joyce became the 2nd Post Commander, when her husband died in 2005. She was the Commanding Officer of the US Naval Sea Cadet program for kids ages 11-17 in New London County.

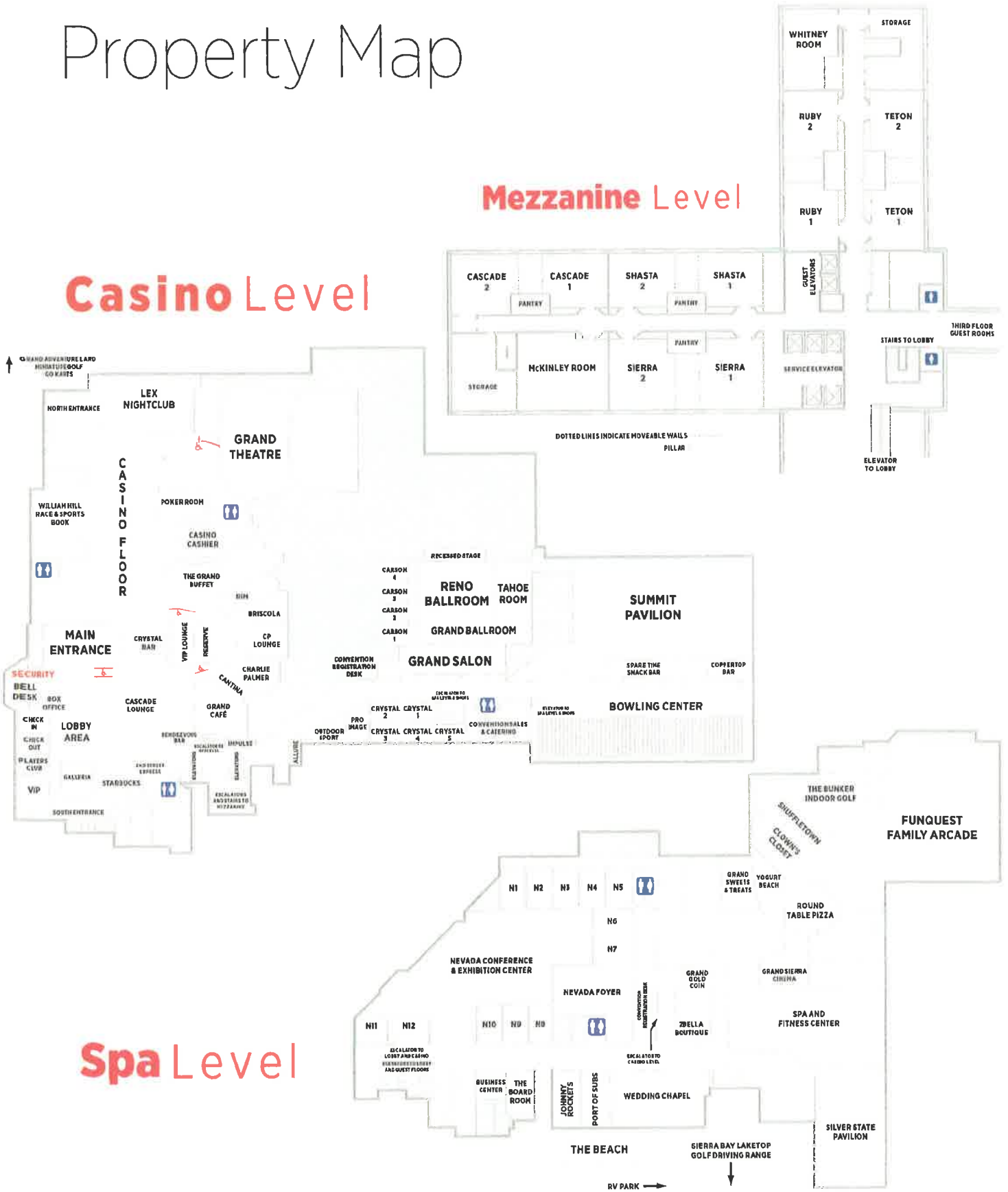

Mezzanine Level

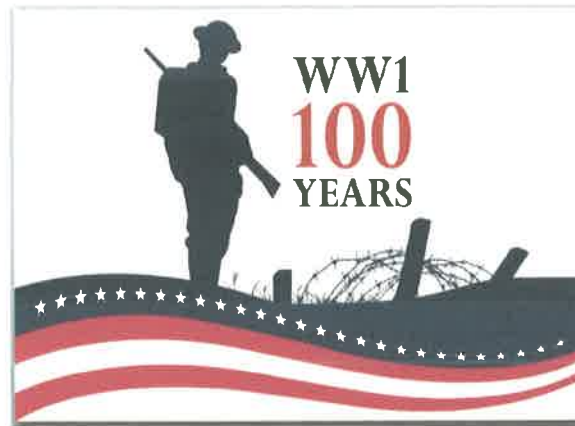

Request to Omit Members from National Mailing of Renewal Notices

Upon the request of a post, members may be coded so that a dues notice will never be mailed to them. For example, this may be necessary for a member who resides in a health care facility and a family member ensures the dues are paid.

The department and post membership register shows the members that should not receive a renewal notice. Check the EX Flag column on the right side of the register between the column headed "CER FLAG" and the column headed "ERA." The character "C" printed in this column means that the member will not receive a dues notice from National Headquarters. Members with a "P" (PUFL), "H" (Post Honorary Life) or "L" (Department "Life" in CO, KS, NE, OH, or PA only) in the "TY" column will not receive a dues notice, but will not have a "C" code since they are automatically excluded from renewal notices.

If posts wish to have additional members omitted from future dues mailings, National Headquarters urges that the request be submitted on the form shown on the following page. This form is **not** being distributed by National Headquarters but departments are free to reproduce and distribute to posts, if they so desire.

Requests to omit members from mailing must be received at National Headquarters at least 30 days before intended receipt date for dues notices. Name, address and member ID number are required for accurate identification of member to be omitted. Do not send a second request to omit a member once the member has been flagged with the code "C."

Once a member's name has been coded "C" to not receive direct membership renewal notices, official Department notification is necessary to remove the code "C" so the member will once again receive renewal notices.

Explanation of "FLAGS" Heading on the Printout

How can you tell if a post has been coded by national headquarters to get a mailing?

On the printout that is initially sent to you with the Post Data Reports, there are headings at the top of each page. One of these is "FLAGS." Mailing participation will be indicated with a "Y" in position 1 and/or 2.

On the listing, if there is an "N" or a "blank" in either of the two positions, it indicates that **NO** member will receive that particular mailing (1st or 2nd).

If a post has an "N" (or a "blank") position 1 or 2, it will be **permanent**, unless the department requests a change.

Any department that has posts that only want to receive the first two renewal notices needs to contact national by the beginning cut-off date of the renewal schedule cycle.

RECAP

1. Follow the schedule.
2. Complete and accurate information on each post is needed.
3. Return Post Data Reports to National – keep printout
4. **Only return forms that have changes.**
5. **YES** means the post members will receive the mailing.
6. **NO** or a **BLANK** means the Post members will **NOT** get the mailing.
