The month of April's activities have started a very active part of my term as National Vice Commander. Department Commander Tom Flowers and I had the honor of participating in recognizing a 105-year-old and 69 continuous year legionnaire Jesse Solafia of Post 75 Middletown with certificates and accolades from the state and national organization. I also had the honor of being a guest speaker at the Town of Somers celebration of the American Legion's Centennial along with our department officers.

The first weekend of April - I visited the Department of Pennsylvania for their DEC Meeting and Department Commander Jim Vollrath's Testimonial, accompanying me on this trip was 3rd District Commander Mike Kellett. The AL Dept of PA has a Housing for Homeless Veterans Corporation. The corporation owns properties, 4 in Pittsburg, 1 in Ephrata, 1 in Philadelphia and 1 in Harrisburg, these homes help homeless veterans' transition back into society. The corporation raises its own funds to operate these homes and provide grants to veterans in need, similar to our own Soldiers Sailors and Marines Fund.

- Third weekend, we were invited to attend a USO Show at the New Hampshire Veterans Home in Tilton. Attended a Connecticut Hurricanes Veterans Appreciation Concert at Seymour Middle School, what an outstanding performance by all! Membership Task Force, Leadership & Learning, and Media (May bulletin message)

This is the year that we had a golden opportunity to really promote The American Legion, in every single community within the state of Connecticut, by taking advantage of our centennial year, and boasting about who we are. The Posts and the communities which did take this opportunity, actually reaped a few of the fruits of their labor, by attracting new members and gaining new contacts and resources within their respective communities. If we want the community to know who at what The American Legion is all about, then it's up to us, as an organization, to go outside of the Post home, and **show** the community that we are **not just a bar or a secret society**, but an organized Veterans Service Organization, rendering services and assistance to other veterans and their families, as well as assisting and guiding the youth of our country. This is why we've taken advantage of the opportunities presented to us, by being visible at numerous home show events, veteran resource fairs, stand downs, and other public events. If we want the public to know about us, we need to go to them, and not sit back waiting for them to come to us. And speaking of sharing information, please start working on getting your **Post Consolidated Reports** together. If you need assistance, please fill free to contact us. Every Post is required to fill one out annually.

With that being said, we've had a fairly good year so far, which is almost coming to an end, in a few months. Yes, I used the term **fair**. We started the year off, running hard right out of the gates, maintain stability for the most part, with our membership numbers, and then as of late, it seems we just petered out like we always do. At the start of the membership year and for numerous months during the year, I've challenged every District Commander with the task of conducting at least one District Revitalization and one District Round Table training session. We had one District which did host each event, and one District that held Post training and Post revitalization, within their own District. There are 7 Districts within our Department, which means there should have been 7 District Revitalizations and 7 District Round Table training sessions. 2 out of 7, just does not cut it, if we want our organization to grow and be around for the next 100 years and beyond.

As a Department, we've spent most of the year holding around 5th place in membership, Nationally, with a high point in January, when we were actually in 1st place for a couple of days. As of this writing, we are now in 12 place at 94.99%, Nationally, with only a 10 days to go for the 100% target date, which I don't see us achieving, at least not by sitting idle. If we miss this target date, we will, as a team, hit the 100% mark for the June target date, but only if we continue to work together. The Buddy Check program kicked off back in March, and I've stated over and over, that we will stay with this program, until the membership year is over, and not to hold it for the one week. Pushing the membership, also comes the task of pushing training. Knowledge and communication are very valuable tools, which we seem to be lacking in many areas. This is the reason we will be conducting District officer training in June of this year, so they are trained immediately and have a full tool box, to start their year, on a positive note. Marketing, visibility, and direct contact are the best ways to stabilize and grow The American Legion, Department of Connecticut. Working as a team, and not leaving the burden with one or two individuals, will make the task at hand, so much easier and enjoyable.

In closing, I want to express my sincerest appreciation to all of the Commission members this year, and the other members of The American Legion family that participated in our meetings and discussion, as well as the help and support at all the various events, where we manned a display booth.

Training, as well as membership, is available all year long, and all you have to do, is ask.

ADJUTANT'S Notes

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Post Tax Reporting

Last Reminder, assuming that your tax year is the calendar year (01/01/2018 – 12/31/2018), and your post's gross receipts were \$50,000 or less, each post has until May 15th to go online and file Form 990-N. As long as your Post EIN is registered with Department & National HQ (and most are) and you haven't missed more than three years. This is a very simple process (unless you are filing one of the longer forms), that ***MUST** be completed in order to maintain your Post's status as a Federal 501C (19) non-profit veterans organization.*

The deadline for submissions is **May 31, 2019**.

Selection of Citizens

In the actual selection of Boys State citizens, merit and ability alone are the basis for selection. Boys State is not a program for underprivileged boys nor is it a summer camp for recreation. American Legion Posts or other community-minded organizations often pay fees, or "tuition," with little to no expense to the young men.

We wish to secure equal delegate representation from all areas of the State of Connecticut. Therefore, the Department Boys State Commission asks for **one or more boy(s) from each accredited high school** (public or private) to be nominated by the school to attend.

Characteristics of the "Ideal" Connecticut Boys Stater

To be selected for nomination or appointment as a Connecticut Boys State delegate, the candidate must demonstrate:

- Strong academic performance (e.g., a quick study) to thrive in this fast moving program
- Excellent Interpersonal skills (e.g., gets along very well with others from all backgrounds)
- Exhibited leadership (e.g., a leader of leaders) Solid Oratorical skills (e.g., a persuasive speaker and confidence shown in group settings)



Nominating a Delegate to the Program

The American Legion believes our American government can survive only with an educated populace. By teaching youth to understand and appreciate our democratic republic, America can remain strong and ensure our freedom for future generations.

High school officials (administrators, faculty members, coaches, fine arts teachers, and/or counselors) may nominate qualified students meeting the eligibility requirements and selection criteria.

Once you have chosen which students you would like to participate you should notify the local American Legion Post that your school has students who are interested in attending the program. The local Post will then either come to the school to interview the students or have them come to the Post to be interviewed so the Post can make their selections on who will attend the program.

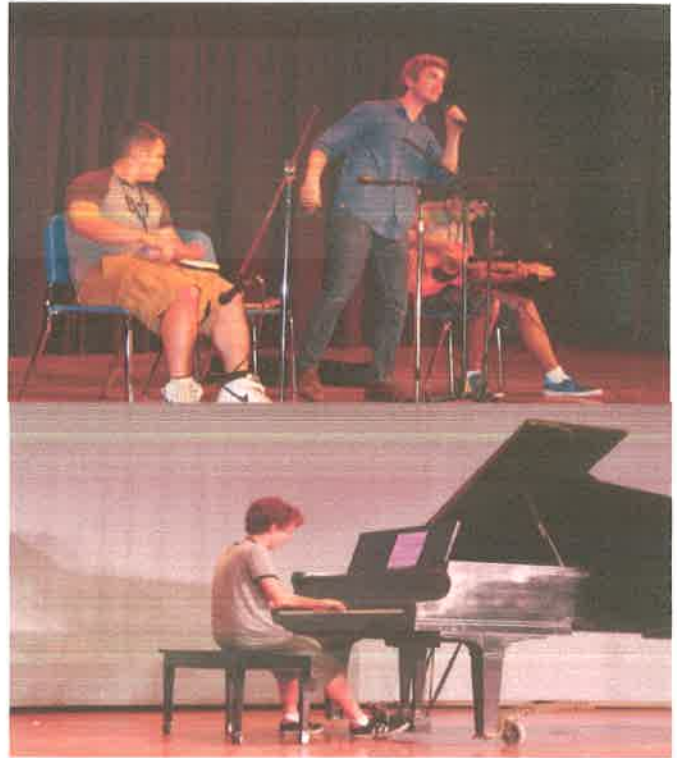

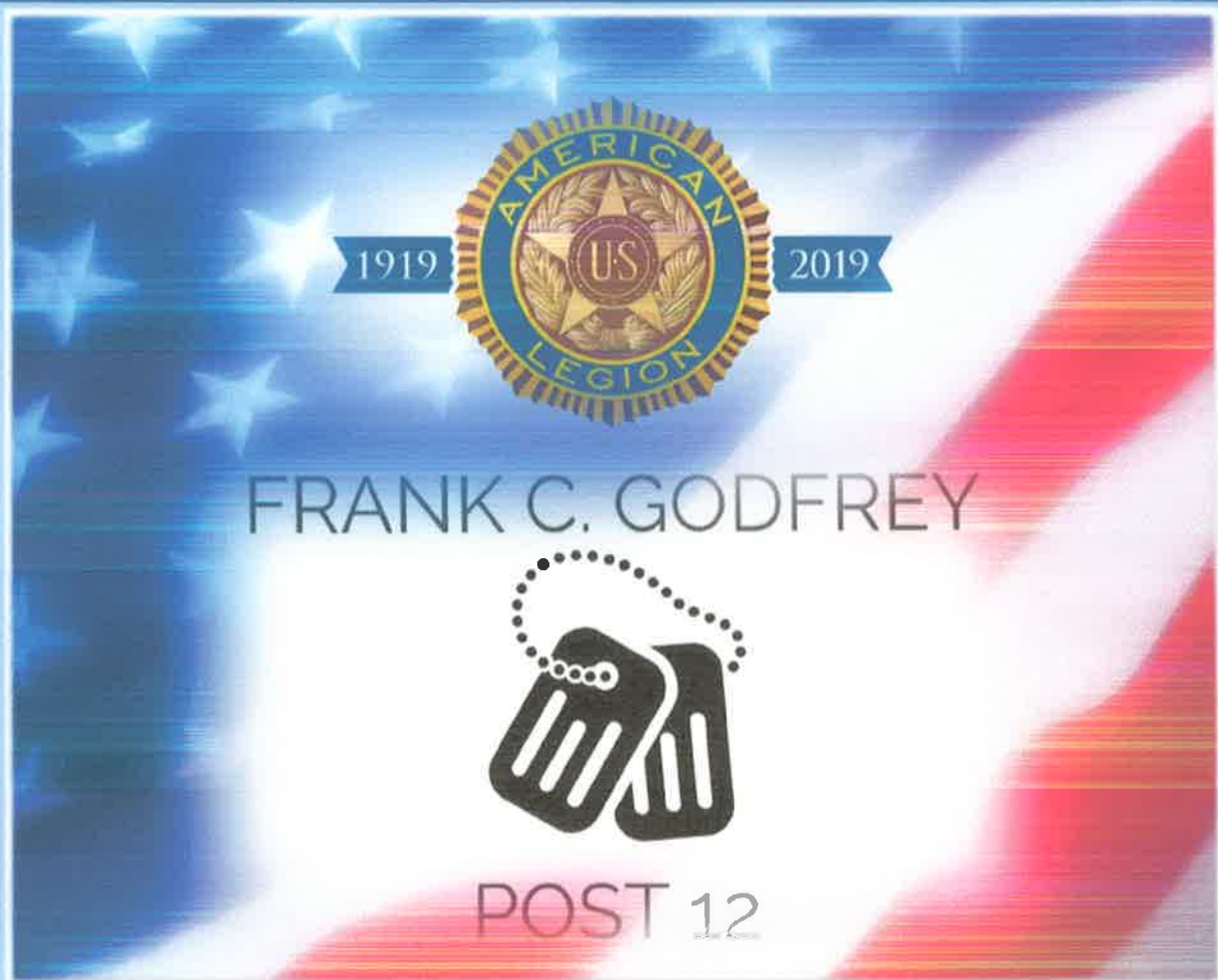

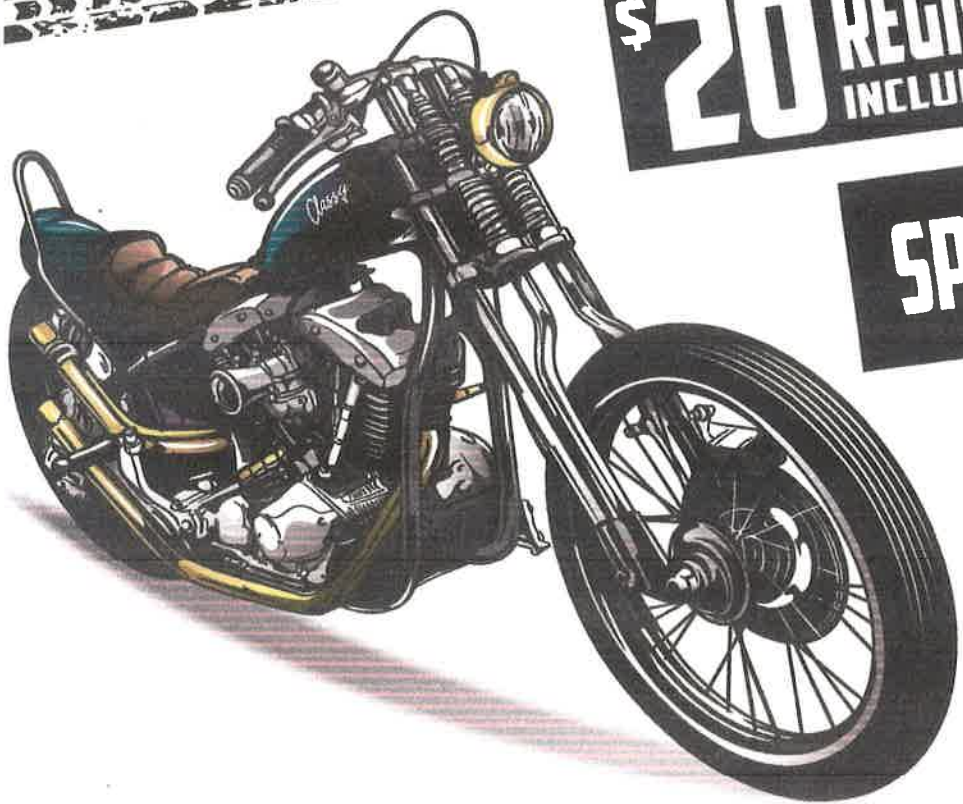

Maternity Care Coordination

The Maternity Care Coordination program (MCC) at VA Connecticut is part of a program that provides maternity care services to pregnant Veterans who receive care at any of the 8 sites in New England. Our MCC program consists of a Registered Nurse and Social Worker who collaborate as a team to follow a Veteran's maternity care throughout pregnancy.

Once your pregnancy is confirmed, your primary care provider enters a consult through the Office of Community Care (OCC). Veterans are then contacted by the Maternity Care Coordinator to enroll in the program. Veterans receive authorization for prenatal care in the community with an OB or certified midwife.

Maternity care benefits include prenatal and postpartum care, genetic testing, labs, ultrasounds, or any other medically indicated diagnostic testing. In addition, there are 7 days of newborn coverage for inpatient and outpatient care including labor and delivery. Veterans also receive contraception

and medication coverage when prescriptions are filled through the VA pharmacy. Veterans can enroll in the delivery hospital's prenatal and parenting classes and request reimbursement from the VA. For Veterans who plan to breastfeed a lactation package can be ordered through the prosthetics department, which includes a breast pump, 3 nursing bras, washable nursing pads, and a maternity or postpartum support belt. Veterans can also receive lactation support if needed.

The team also provides two postpartum follow up calls that include screening for depression and intimate partner violence to offer appropriate support and follow up.

The MCC program has had over 1,000 enrollments since it started in March 2014. For more information about services and the program, contact us at **Judy Kuzdeba** at (413)265-1300 and **Sofia Reddy** at (508) 562-1973. Talk to your primary care provider if you would like a referral!

We work with patients with a variety of treatment needs such as: issues with intimacy, trust, communication, emotional connection; reintegration; and healing relationships from the effects of PTSD, substance use, and other mental health disorders. We provide support on parenting and relational issues such as preparing siblings for arrival of a new baby, co-parenting, blended family issues, and more.

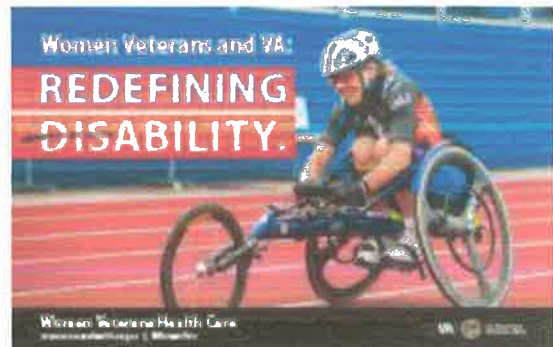

Redefining Disability

This campaign encourages Veterans to consider lesser-known prosthetic items specific to women and take advantage of VA's commitment to help them lead an active and fulfilling life or participate in an adaptive sport. VA offers access to a variety of care services for Veterans with disabilities and supports women by providing prosthetic items to meet their unique needs.



The term "prosthetic" includes any medical device that supports or replaces loss of a body part or function. This includes support items for incontinence or pelvic floor issues, wigs for alopecia, customized orthotics and artificial limbs, post-mastectomy items such as undergarments with discreet pockets to hold prosthetics, and more. They also have access to mobility aids such as walkers and wheelchairs, hearing aids and eye glasses, communication and assistive devices, and durable medical equipment. For more information:

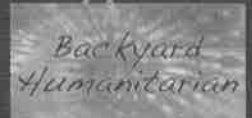

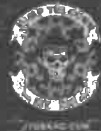
