To All Legionnaires,

I was worried about what I would write about this month, but as luck would have it during my travels this month several issues came up that need to be addressed.

- 1. <u>Membership</u> During my travels this past month there have been several disturbing issues that have come to my attention.
  - A. Online Renewals We still have posts out there who don't understand how to submit online renewals to department headquarters. When you submit your cards to department you must write online on the national portion of the card so they know that this person has already paid thus eliminating the double payment issues. Please spread the word so everyone understands what must be done so posts don't call the department office wondering why their membership totals were reduced because of something that is in your control to prevent.
  - B. <u>Deceased Members</u> This issue is common across the entire department, posts need to be registered with myLegion.Org. When a member passes away it is important that the post reports the deceased member to national so they are removed from any future mailings. If they have already paid for the year their membership still counts for your post. There is nothing more embarrassing to a post when a family member calls to inform the post that their loved one passed away several months ago and you have sent them a mailing for something or they are still receiving mailings from National Headquarters, it makes it look like your post is not in touch with your membership and doesn't care about your members. The second reason it is important to report deceased members to National so when the department is asked to print out a list of deceased members for either a post or district it is as current as possible. Individual posts can print a current list out on myLegion.org as can the department and this is a valuable tool when we perform our memorial services.
  - C. Membership Eligibility It has come to my attention recently that there are several posts out there who don't know what the eligibility requirements are to become members in the American Legion. I received a letter from an individual that a post turned away a potential new member because they thought they were required to serve overseas to become a member. I have also heard two stories of potential new members being turned away because posts thought individuals had to serve at least 90 days active duty to be eligible, these are all incorrect. Potential Legion members do not have to serve overseas and all potential members only need serve one day of active duty (Title 10) to be eligible to join as long as it is during any of the dates approved by congress. If anyone has eligibility questions please call the Adjutants office before turning away potential new members and in all these cases these were Iraqi War Veterans. This is unacceptable as we cannot afford to turn away any new members.
  - D. 100% Membership Goal As we get closer to the May 11<sup>th</sup> 100% goal set by National it has become increasingly clear that we may not make this goal, with that being said there is perhaps a more important goal at stake here. For the past two years we have continued to grow our membership without reaching the 100% goal and currently we are about 347 members behind last year's pace. We have an opportunity to again show a positive increase in membership as long as we continue to work our current membership all the way to the end of June. I am encouraging all posts in the department to take those last few membership cards and make some calls or visits to those members and get them to renew, as long as we continue to show an increase in membership each year we will make our goal of 22,000 members by the centennial year 2019. Please help us achieve our goal it is in your hands.

We have some programs coming up and I highly encourage everyone to participate in one or all of them, these programs are what we are all about and we need to get into our communities and schools to promote them. This is how we get potential new members to join our local posts, when they see what we do and what we stand for it makes it easier for them to join when they see something that may interest them or their family.

<u>Legion Family College</u> – Please consider sending your post members to this outstanding opportunity to learn about the history of the American Legion and also learn about how to run a post meeting, officers and their responsibilities, Legion ceremonies, Media Relations much much more. The Sons of the American Legion and the Auxiliary will also have some breakout sessions, so all are encouraged to come out for a weekend of fun, camaraderie and learning.


<u>Boys State</u> — All posts are encouraged to visit your local high schools and seek those students who are interested in learning about city, town and state government. This is an intense week where the delegates get hands on experience on how the government works, they will get to learn how to write bills, conduct elections at all levels, argue bills, campaign and attend lectures hosted by several public officials. The cost is \$300.00 for each student and we are looking for around 240 boys this year, please help us make this a successful program as it has been in the past.

<u>Department Golf Tournament</u> – Calling all posts, we are looking for golfers to come out and enjoy a day of golf and get an opportunity to meet National Commander Mike Helm. Anyone can play, it is not just for legion members, we encourage you to invite anyone who would be interested in playing and remember that all of the proceeds go towards the support of our Legion programs. The cost is \$100.00 per person which includes 18 holes of golf, golf cart, and a steak dinner at the Blackledge Country Club in Hebron, CT.

<u>Americanism Award</u> – Each post should have received an application for the Department Americanism Award. If you know someone whether they are a legionnaire or an individual who supports Veterans, please consider filling out the application and submitting them for consideration. The deadline is May 15<sup>th</sup>; please don't pass up an opportunity to see someone recognized who truly supports our Veterans.

I would like to give a quick update on the Commanders Project. Thanks to your generosity we have surpassed the \$9,300.00 mark. We are fast approaching my goal of \$10,000.00 and I look forward to surpassing that goal. Again, thank you for all of the donations and for those who haven't made a donation please consider donating to a worthy project within our own state.





Finally, I am taking a moment to share details about my limited edition "Commanders Membership Pin". This pin will be awarded to anyone who recruits two new members in their post. The deadline to submit for this award is May 12<sup>th</sup>. All you have to do is send me an email with the names you recruited and I will verify them with the Adjutants office, once they have been verified you will be awarded the pin at Department Convention. First Annual Membership Round-up, though not perfectly successful, was something to bring some fun to the membership process. Hopefully we can add to the idea in the future. SAL Area East Cmdr. Richard Lurette and I traveled to the District Walk Sites and picked up 32 membership renewals. Thank you to all for participating.

2<sup>nd</sup> District Revitalization was held April 23 – 25, 2015 at Post 34 Milford in the Fowler Building. There were 7 of 29 posts represented, not a good message to send back to the National Organization. Many may not realize the effort that goes into planning and executing such an event. This was an opportunity for Posts to come together, that don't normally have the time to make phone calls to Post 200 members in their area, as well as call their own expired members. This was the last District Revitalization for our Department, as all Districts have been given the training and opportunity. 2<sup>nd</sup> District Commander Tom Flowers made a great phone script, that National took back for consideration to modify the national provided phone script. Great job!

**Property Tax Relief:** If you are 65 and older and your adjusted gross income is \$34,600 single, \$42,200 married. You could qualify for the Elderly Benefit a tax abatement of up to \$1200. If you qualify for the Elderly Benefit and you are a Veteran, you also qualify for an additional Veterans Exemption. Contact your Tax Assessor's Office for an application and further details that may apply for your Municipality. Just fill-out the application and provide copies of your Federal and State Income Tax Returns to your Assessor no Later than **May 15, 2015**.

#### Remember:

Use the tools provided to get new members into your posts. Especially consider using your Town/City Veterans Tax Exemption list.

Women may also be Veterans. While out recruiting, don't overlook the obvious.

Collectively our goal is to reach 100% membership in the Department of Connecticut.

### Post Tax Reporting

A FINAL Reminder: Assuming that your tax year is the calendar year (01/01/2014 – 12/31/2014), and your post's gross receipts were \$50,000 or less, each post has until May 15<sup>th</sup> to go online and file Form 990-N. As long as your Post EIN is registered with Department & National HQ (and most are), this is a very simple process (unless you are filing one of the longer forms) that <u>MUST</u> be completed in order to maintain your Post's status as a Federal 501C(19) non-profit veterans organization. ### Quote taken from the 6<sup>th</sup> Department Convention minutes, page 162

I call you back to the inception of The American legion, here in Connecticut: June 10, 1919; some 96 years ago. Our paramount issue, our first pillar, was the caring for our returning veteran, who was disabled. Since those early days, we have spread our wings to help all veterans with such diseases as Agent Orange and muster gas.

But the day that we forget and the day that we hesitate to think of those lads whose blood is that which is contained in the Poppy alone in the color, the blood that they shed on the fields of Flanders, when we forget them then we must turn in our charters."

Remembering, talking about the past, present and future will remind us what is important!

When we were kids, birthdays were a big thing. Now, we have milestones like 29, 50, 70 and 100, these are the times we celebrate.

When I was 50, a friend put a sheet on my fence...noting FRAZIER is 50! My mom baked me a cake, my wife took me out to dinner and the kids gave me a birthday card.

That's what I would like us to do. Bake a cake, put up a billboard, march in a parade, dance the night away and celebrate this unbelievable milestone at the Post, District and Department. We need to tell the story about The American Legion, these last 96 years.

The following Uniform Committee Report, paraphrased, was taken from the 1930 Department Convention, Bridgeport Central School, p 93-95.

### Report of the Connecticut American Legion Uniform Committee

The uniform committee:

- H. C. Jackson: Chairman
- E. L. White

The following design was adopted by the committee. On 30 April 1930, the design was approved by the Department Executive Committee, embodying the following specifications.

These Uniform specifications are for all Connecticut American Legion posts.

MATERIAL: William Whitman 14 ounce Blue Serge No. 2684, shade 887

STYLE: Single breasted, peak lapel collar, straight front sack made to fit easy over the chest and shoulders and to be slightly fitted at the waist so as to conform to the figure. The coat should be buttoned down the front with four gilt American Legion buttons of adopted standard, equally spaced, the top button to be placed approximately on a horizontal line with the armpits, the lower edge of the lower button to be on a line with the top of the lower pocket flap.

**LENGTH:** Coat to extend about one (1) inch below the crotch according to the height of the wearer.

**COLLAR:** The Collar should be approximately 15  $\frac{1}{2}$  on a size: 36. And along the outside edge with the ends cut slightly back, should not be more than 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide at center back and not more than 2 inches wide at the notches.

**LAPELS:** Top line of the lapel to be horizontal and not more than 2/3 inches wide at notch, to be approximately 9 inches in length along the outer edge.

**NOTCH:** The notch located between the collar and lapel should not be wider than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch nor narrower than  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch.

**SKIRT:** The skirt should cover and full over the hips with back centre vent not over 10 inches in length. Front edge to overlap and appear straight from lapel and remain overlapped without the use of hooks and eyes.

POCKETS: Two breast pockets with flaps, flaps to be cut square and buttoned with small buttons, pockets to have box pleat 1½ inches in width on vertical centre line. Breast pockets should be a suitable size according to the size of the coat button but not to exceed 6½ inches deep, 5¾ inches wide at top. Lower pockets to be hung inside the lining in the body of the skirt covered with square flaps, flaps to be buttoned with small buttons and to measure approximately 2 7/8 inches wide, 3¼ inches at top and 8¾ inches at the bottom.

LININGS: Coats to be full lined of Black Imported Venetian lining to be the matching color of outside material.

ORNAMENTS: On left sleeve head to have seal of the State with letters Connecticut below. Seal outline and letters to be submitted in yellow silk with grapevines of bright dark green and white background. Ornament size will be 3 inches long and 2 ¼ inches wide. On each lapel embroidered American Legion emblem as adopted style 1 ¼ inch from outside and 1 inch top edges of lapel also Colonial buff braid on cuffs, ½ inch wide; On lower collar edge ½ inch from edge shall be work gilt metal numerals designating Post number, size of numerals to be ½ inch, block style.

**BUTTONS:** The coat to be fastened with thirty ligne buttons, pocket flaps with 24 ligne buttons. American Legion buttons will be used that are the old or new style as supplied by National Headquarters.

TROUSERS: Trousers will be made of the same material as the coat: Plain button style. A stripe will be placed on the side seams. The stripe should be 1 ¼ inch wide and the color should be Colonial buff, like the present Department Hat/cap top.

HATS/CAPS: Caps should be regulation National American Legion Style buff tops.

**BELT:** The Uniform Belt should be the "Roundabout Fairleather" belt that is 1  $\frac{1}{4}$  inches wide with a square brass buckle with centre prong.

**WOMEN:** A Woman's uniform should be similar to a man's uniform, substituting skirt for trousers. Skirts should be the same material, plain circle style with two side kick plaits.

Paid-Up-For-Life Application Processing Change

In January 2014, National Headquarters introduced a new simplified pricing structure for its Paid-Up-For-Life (PUFL) plan which also included the ability for a member to apply online for lifetime membership. This was done with the intent of simplifying the entire process for the member.

Beginning July 1, 2015, National Headquarters will no longer accept PUFL applications that were previously distributed in bulk to Departments or Posts. This includes <u>any PUFL</u> application reflecting a rate chart with the effective date of October 2009 or earlier.

All PUFL applications must be submitted to National by one of the three methods noted below. We will continue the policy of notifying the Post and Department when a member applies for a lifetime membership; this provides the opportunity for the Post to challenge the application, if necessary.

ONLINE APPLICATION: The member accesses the PUFL page on National's website at <a href="www.legion.org/pufl">www.legion.org/pufl</a> to obtain a rate quote and/or submit an electronic application. Once the rate quote is received, the member can opt to apply online which will cause their record information to appear for confirmation purposes. Once confirmed and the payment information is completed, the member selects the Submit button to complete the application process. NOTE: If the member doesn't have internet access, either themselves or through family/friends, this process should be performed by the Post or the Department. A quick link to the PUFL application website has been added to <a href="mailto:my.Legion">my.Legion</a> for Posts and Departments.

PRINTABLE APPLICATION: The member accesses the PUFL page on National's website at <a href="www.legion.org/pufl">www.legion.org/pufl</a> to obtain a rate quote and/or print an application. Once the rate quote is received, the member can opt to print a paper application to complete and mail to National Headquarters. The application will be pre-filled with the member's ID Number, Name, Address, Birth Date and the total cost of the PUFL membership. (If any of the member's information needs to be updated, it can be noted on the application.) The member then simply mails the application and payment to National Headquarters at the address shown on the form. NOTE: If the member doesn't have internet access, either themselves or through family/friends, the application should be printed by the Post or the Department and forwarded to the member for completion. A quick link to the PUFL application website has been added to myLegion for Posts and Departments.

CALL A CUSTOMER SERVICE SPECIALIST: Any member can speak to one of National's Customer Service Specialists by calling our toll free number at 800-433-3318. They're happy to answer any questions...print and mail a PUFL application...or even take the application over the phone. However, this should not be considered the primary procedure since all members, Posts, and Departments have the same ability.

NOTE: Beginning July 1, 2015, Paid-Up-For-Life applications submitted to National Headquarters on old forms will <u>not</u> be processed; they will be forwarded to the Department Headquarters for review and handling.
