# The Legionnaire Insurance Trust Holds Its 49th Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors

CHICAGO, Illinois (May 2, 2014) - The Board of Directors of the Legionnaire Insurance Trust (LIT) held their forty-ninth annual meeting on April 15, 2014 in Scottsdale, Arizona. Forty-seven of the forty-nine participating Departments – state organizations of The American Legion – were represented at the meeting.

Since its inception in 1966, the LIT has returned around one billion dollars in benefits to insured

This year, the Board met to receive the financial report for the past year, and to distribute nearly \$2.5 million to participating departments. The report outlined both the 2013 activities and 2014 plans on behalf of the Trust and introduced the proposed changes and additions to the Trust's portfolio of products. Additionally, Board officers were elected for the coming year.

The Board Meeting also included a new award presented by the agent/administrator – AGIA Affinity Services – the John J. "Jack" Flynn Trophy to honor the Department that excelled in promoting the programs and services of the Legionnaire Insurance Trust in the prior year. Jack Flynn was the founding Chairman of the LIT and served in that




# Public Act No. 14-114

# AN ACT CONCERNING CLUBS OPERATED BY NATIONALLY CHARTERED VETERANS' SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 30-23a of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2014*):

No person shall be construed to be a guest of a member of a club within the intent of section 30-23 or of a golf country club within the intent of section 30-24a until [his] such person's name and address has been entered in the guest book maintained for such purposes on the club or golf country club premises, together with the signature of the member and the date of introduction, provided neither the permittee nor any person employed to dispense alcoholic beverages on such premises, during his working hours on such premises, shall enter such person's name in such book. The requirement of this section (1) shall not apply to a member of any nationally chartered veterans' service organization when such member enters a club run by such organization that is not such member's home club, but is affiliated with the same organization, provided such member shall show a membership, travel card or similar identification as a member of such organization upon entry to such club, and (2) may be waived by the Department of Consumer Protection on special occasions upon written application.

# 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Vietnam War

Connecticut is expecting more than 30,000 people at the Connecticut Air Guard in East Granby and the New England Air Museum in Windsor Locks when it commemorates the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War on July 10-12, 2015 with a **Vietnam 50th Celebration** weekend. All are invited to come recognize and honor New England's Vietnam Veterans and honor, by remembrance, those who did not return.

This three-day event (sponsored by the CCSU Veterans History Project, the New England Air Museum, the Connecticut National Guard, Bradley International Airport, the Connecticut Department of Veterans' Affairs, and the Association of the United States Army) will feature amazing vehicle and aircraft displays, helicopter rides in the famous UH-1D "Huey," and a complete, six aircraft rescue demonstration by "The Sky Soldiers" each day. Other unique features of the event include hands-on demonstrations, "fly-bys" and static displays of vehicles and equipment operated by our armed forces during the war. Vietnam era aircraft at the New England Air Museum will be open for cockpit tours, manned by Vietnam Veterans. Individual stories of veterans will be presented along with memorabilia. Sure to be popular will be the "Veterans' Gathering" tent for veterans to reunite and reconnect!

Additionally, there will be programs specifically designed to remember those who gave the "last full measure of devotion". Exhibits featuring a "Wall of Letters," photo displays of veterans who were KIA or MIA, and special events for Gold Star Families will be featured.

This event is designed to educate a new generation about the Vietnam War and the part it played in the lives of our friends, relatives and neighbors whose stories are the building blocks of American History. All high schools will be eligible to enter a history competition about the war.

A highlight of each day will be "Rescue at Dawn", a one-of-a-kind, Army combat aerial re-enactment demonstrating the rescue of a downed pilot by the "Sky Soldiers". Six Vietnam Era air craft take part in this exciting rescue simulation as multiple Cobras, Hueys and Scout planes locate, defend, and rescue a downed airman.
