There are many ways to show our support as a Veteran, including service specific ball caps and shirts.

Again, *The American Legion* is active on issues that affect veterans, the military and issues that affect Legion programs or positions. We do not endorse candidates.



PLEASE READ AT YOUR NEXT MEETING

TO: All Post & District Commanders, Centennial chairs, committee members and volunteers.

At our last Centennial Committee Executive meeting, several areas were discussed and agreed upon.

- 1.) All Posts should consider "planting a tree", as part of their planned events, (location of site may vary) to honor the American Legion's 100th Anniversary, with a permanent plaque to indicate such. Posts should now be doing their planning, selecting possible sites, and logistics involved.
- 2.) An additional option for Posts is to plant a "Victory garden", as was done during WWII, which was done to supply more food. This is only a suggestion to consider. Posts should discuss possible areas, what and when to plant, available sunlight, ability to water, and logistics, etc.
- 3.) Your local Centennial celebration ideas, events, or other plans? The Posts & Districts should by now have established a Centennial Committee, a chairperson, and members.

Please submit your projected plans and Post and District events to subcommittee chairman Olson see e-mail below! Please, I need e-mails & chairmen names.

NOW is a good time to begin contacting local leaders for your honorary Centennial Chairpersons. Senators, city or state representatives, Mayors or 1st selectman make good candidates.

Allow plenty of lead time if you want them at your event! Invite them formally, not by just phone alone. Refer them to our Legion and centennial celebration website. Plan events and invite them to attend and speak.

For years 2018-2019, consider tying in your regular events, as well as some special centennial events. Use the 100th Anniversary logo provided. Fundraisers, dinners, dances, bowling, golf, picnics, etc. can all be included in with and under the 100th Anniversary celebration!

Be sure to put your Centennial plans on your website and social media, local newspapers, cable TV, radio, etc. Share your plans and events with the widest possible groups!






